


I do remember that I General Harris of Jones County

 body that it is appointed for all men once to die, I made
 a will and Testament in manner & form following - First of all I desire my body to be decently
 buried in which having provided & my sole I becomend God
 that gave it, and taking my worldly estate my will is that
 all my just debts be paid first within convenient time after
 my decease. - Then I give as much of my stock to my love
 children namely Elizabeth my wife & Joseph as may best
 Educate & support them till they get business. Then I give to
 my beloved wife Amelia the use of all the remainder part of
 my estate during the term of her natural life or till her death and
 afterward to give the use of my estate to be Equally
 divided between my wife and my four children namely as a true
 Elizabeth my wife and four sons unto their heirs
 forever lawfully I appoint my wife Amelia executrix to
 satisfy both Executors and satisfy and confirm to be my last
 will & Testament and cannot alter this my will and seal in presence
 of witnesses the 25th of the 9th mo 1798

 be apply'd to purchase a building Wench for the benefit of my Children

Item I Give unto my beloved wife Rebecca Grimes all my Estate both Real and
 Personal, of whatever nature or kind whatsoever, until my son Samuel
 Grimes arrives to the age of Twenty one year, at which time I mean an
 equal division of all the Land both in Quantity and Quality, between
 my sons Samuel and Alex Grimes and likewise at the same time an
 division of all my Personal Estate equally between my wife two and
 three Daughters

Item After my son Samuel and Daughter Nancy have received their parts
 (which I suppose will be nearly at one time) I mean that my other two
 Daughters Sarah & Charlotte's shares as well as my son Alex's should
 remain on the hands of my wife until there be three come of age
 but should my wife marry in the time I order that her share which is the
 same as a girl, be delivered up to my Executors for the benefit of my
 Children equally, and that her three Heirs she has had be just to my
 two youngest Daughters & her be likewise delivered to my Executors for
 their use - And lastly I do hereby nominate, constitute and create my
 well beloved friend Daniel Hester and John Hester to be my whole and
 sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament and do hereby utterly
 disallow disannul & make void all and every Will or Wills, legacies and
 bequests, mortgages, debts or made, written and leguished, Ralphy and
 Informing this to be no other than my last Will and Testament, In witness
