In the name of God amen. I Anna B Hardie of the County of Lenoir and State of South Carolina being of sound mind and memory, and knowing the uncertainty of life, do make this my last will and testament. First I will and desire that my remains be deposited in the Cemetery in which lies the remains of my parents, and that a suitable monument be erected over my remains. Item I hereby give devise and bequeath to my Sister Mary Emily Kinsley the Brick Store, now occupied by Mr R. Rayner, as a Dry Goods Store, on the Corner of Lenoir and King streets, and the ground it stands upon 21 feet front and running back West to the King line 105 feet beginning and containing 21 feet front north to south and 105 feet from East to West with all the privileges belonging thereto, her natural life time and at her death to her child or children if any. Item I hereby give devise and bequeath to my Sister Miss Agnes Parrott Pollock the Brick Store now occupied by Miss Haskett and Davis as a Grocery Store, and the ground it stands upon 21 feet front and running back West to the King line 105 feet, and also to her 10 feet of the ground lying between said Brick Store and the Store and Dwelling now occupied by Mr J B Rainer beginning and containing 31 feet from north to south and 105 feet from East to West with all the privileges belonging thereto, her natural life time and at her death to her child or children if any. Item I hereby give devise and bequeath to my Sister Susan Elizabeth Hardie the Store and Dwelling now occupied by Mr J B Rainer and the ground it stands upon and also to her the ground between it and the ground heretofore mentioned beginning and containing about 48 feet front, front North by South and 105 feet from East to West with all the privileges belonging thereto, her life time and at her death to her child or children if any. Item I hereby give devise and bequeath to my Sister Miss Phillis Davis Sutton the House and lot, known as lot no. 125 & 126, with all the privileges belonging thereto her natural life time and at her death to her child or child if any. I hereby will and direct that, should any of my Sisters die leaving child or children to inherit the property herein bequeathed to them, that the said part of property

is to pass to my nearest heirs I then I here by
give devise and Bequeath my Personal Property
to my heirs Amelia & Robert Harder and Mollie St-
Emily Pollock. I will and direct that there be paid
to my once nurse Jane Cobb the amount of Twenty
Dollars annually for 5 years, as a token of my esteem
for her I will and direct that the sum of Twenty Dollars
to be given to Holland Cobb. These amounts to be
paid out of my Personal property by my Executor.
I hereby constitute and appoint my friend Dr. John
A. Pollock as my Executor. In testimony whereof
