Victoria Kennedy the sum of five hundred dollars

to her and her personal representatives forever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my brother, E. B. Kennedy,  
my gold watch and chain. And it is my will and de-  
sire that all the rest and residue of my estate after pay-  
ing the legacies above mentioned, shall be paid over to  
my said youngest brother, E. B. Kennedy, to him his  
heirs and personal representatives forever.

It is my will and desire that my executor, herein-  
after named shall at my death take possession of my  
stock of merchandize at Falling Creek in said county  
and sell and dispose of the same either publicly or pri-  
vately, as in his judgment may be for the best interest  
of my estate, and that he collect all notes, book ac-
