Will

I, Huldah I. Kennedy of the State of North Carolina and County of Senoir, being of sound mind and memory, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existance, do make and declare this my last Will and Testament, that is to say:

First, That my executor (whom after named) shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relatives and friends, and pay all funeral expenss together with my just debts howsoever and to whomsoever owing out of the moneys that may first come into his hands as a part or parcel of my estate. Item, I give and devise to my beloved son Oscar H. Kennedy a one half interest in the following tract or lot of land adjoining the lands of Benjamin

J Parrott, J. O. Sutton, and others, Beginning at two ash trees on or near the run of Gum Swamp and runs S 24 E 137 1/2 poles to a stake, thence S 81 W. 13 1/2 poles to a pine, thence N 87 1/2 W. 19 1/2 poles to a pine, thence N 87 1/2 W. 16 1/2 poles to a stake thence S 86. 00 48 poles to a stake, thence N. 76 W. 60 1/2 poles to a good ditch, thence down the same S. 8 W. E. 29 1/2 poles to the run of Gum Swamp, thence running up the run of the said Gum Swamp to the beginning, containing 150 acres, more or less, known as lot No. 8, in the divisions of the lands Wm Sutton, to have and to hold to him and his heirs in fee simple forever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my beloved son Oscar H. Kennedy, my horse and buggy, household and kitchen furniture, together with all the rest and residue of my personal property of every description to him and his assigns forever.

Item - I give and bequeath to my beloved son Bright Kennedy a one half interest in the above describe tract of land for and during the term of his natural life and at his death the same shall go and descend to each of the heirs of his body as he shall leave him surviving, and should the said Bright Kennedy leave no children then it is my will and desire that the above lands devised to him shall go and descend to my beloved son Oscar H. Kennedy to him and his heirs in fee simple forever, and.

Lastly, I do hereby constitute my beloved son Oscar H. Kennedy my lawful Executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last Will and Testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause of the same hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other Wills by me heretofore made.
