In the name of God Amen.
 I. Sarah Smith of the County of Lincoln and State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and memory and considering the uncertainty of this frail and transitory life, do therefore make, ordain, publish, and declare this to be my last will and testament; that is to say, First after all my lawful debts are paid and discharged, the residue of my estate, real and personal I give, bequeath and dispose of as follows, to-wit: To my sister Leah Smith all my personal property, one mare and buggy cutter, hogs, corn and fodder, pork, farming utensils, household matters &c including every thing else the land and appurtenances situated thereon, lying in Pink Hill Township in said County on the south side of the path that leads from the Job Smith place to and by Buck Branch School house adjoining J. H. Nobles land during the term of her single life and after marriage or her death to my brother G. H. Smiths eldest son D. P. Smith. I also put in to the hands of my Brother G. H. Smith the remainder of my land lying on the north side of said path and on the south side of Trent River to have and to hold the said parcel of land until his eldest son becomes twenty one years of age then I give to him (D. P. Smith) the said remainder or parcel of land. The entire tract of land contains ninety acres more or less. To my sister Julia Smith County five dollars. To my brother Thomas H. Smith three dollars. To my sister Zephia Strode three lines one dollar each. Likewise I make, constitute, and appoint my Brother G. H. Smith to be executor of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made.
