I, Jas. H. Davis of the County of Lenoir and State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and memory, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this my last Will and testament in manner and form following, that is to say:

First I desire that my body be decently buried, suitable to the wishes of my relations and friends, and such expenses, together with my just debts, however and to whomsoever owing, be paid out of the first moneys that may come into my representatives hands.

Item: I give and devise to my deceased wife's mother Mrs. Susan C. Canady for and during her natural life, the house and lot where I now live, situate, lying and being in the Town of Kingston, just back of the Court House Square, adjoining the lots of Mrs. R. Phillips, H. T. Stooly & others - Also I give and bequeath unto Mrs. Susan C. Canady all the household furniture of every kind, together with the kitchen furniture, on said premises at my death, to have as hers absolutely. Also I give and bequeath unto her, her choice, one buggy and horse together with harness, out of any that I may have in hand at my death.

Item: I give, devise and bequeath unto J. Herman Canady, son of R. H. Canady, the Long property, lying in the town of Kingston, on Queen Street, adjoining the lots of Susan Nichol, J. H. Bellin's & others, to have and to hold to him and his heirs forever in fee simple.

Item: I give and bequeath unto Sarahannah Howard wife of John Howard, Deborah Robb wife of R. H. Robb, and Elizabeth Taylor wife of John Taylor, each five Dollars.

Item: The balance and residue of my property, both real and personal of every kind and description whatsoever that I now have or may have at my death, together with the reversionary interest in the house and lot which I have given to Mrs. Susan C. Canady for life - see in Item above - and every other interest in lands that I have at my death, I give and devise, to be equally divided, share and share alike, to Sarah Robb, wife of J. H. Robb, and Elkanah Davis. To have and to hold to them and their heirs in fee simple.
