John Johnson being of sound mind and memory before God do make publick & declare this to be my last will and testament in manner and form following, to wit, I commit my soul to God who gave it when I die & so my will and desire after my death that my body be decently buried and my just debts & funeral expenses paid by my executors herein after mentioned - I do give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth, all of my property of every description to her, her heirs and assigns for ever. Do hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth Johnson sole executrix to this my last will and testament revoking all others in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal.
