Item 3rd I give and bequeath to my beloved Brother Samuel E. McCoy five dollars.

Item 4th I give and bequeath to my beloved Brother James A. McCoy five dollars.

Item 5th I give and bequeath to my beloved sister Zephia A. Rose five dollars.

Item 6th I give and bequeath to my beloved Sister Luvnia Abbott my Bedstead, Bed, and Bed clothing and fifty dollars in money.

Item 7th I leave after my burial expenses shall have been paid one hundred dollars to be divided upon my debts.

Item 8th I leave give and bequeath (after the foregoing shall have been complied with) all the balance of my estate to be divided equally between my sister Luvnia Abbott & my beloved Brother John F. McCoy. Given under my hand and seal this
