I, W. A. Phillips of the State of North Carolina, and County of Lenoir being of sound mind and memory, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this to be my last will and testament in manner and form following, that is, to say:

First. That my executor hereinafter to be named shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my friends, and pay all funeral expences, together with my just debts howsoever and to whomsoever owing out of the moneys that may first come into his hands as a part or parcel of my estate.

Item. It is my will and desire that my executor shall sell all of my real estate of every description wheresoever situated and especially my plantation in Contentne a Neck Township in said County, adjoining the lands of W. H. Dountree, C. J. Brooks and others the same to be paid for in five equal instalments, as follows: the first payment to be cash and the other four to be paid in equal yearly instalments with interest from date of sale at the rate of 8%, and when the same shall be paid for in full that he, my said Executor, shall make title in fee to the purchaser.

Item. I give and bequeath to my cousin James Harter all of my personal property except that herein after specifically bequeathed to other persons to be his absolutely and forever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my little friend Mill Pate, son of Capt. W. J. Pate, my breech loading double shot gun, game bag, and all equipments thereto belonging. Also my bird dog named "Guss" to be his solely and absolutely forever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my cousin Sue Phillips, daughter of Thos Phillips, my gold medal on one side of which is inscribed "Franklin Horner School Society, and on the other "Orators W. A. Phillips medal".

Item. It is my will and desire that my executor shall out of the moneys arising from the sale of my lands, or that may come into his hands in any other manner as a part or parcel of my estate, erect or cause to be erected, suitable tombstones to the memory of my father, mother and brother Henry and myself, at our family burying ground in the Neck Township, also cause to be enclosed with a substantial iron fence, our grave yard at a cost not to exceed the sum of seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$750.00).

I give and bequeath to the two children of W. A. Phillips, my

cousin, five hundred dollars each.

Item. I give and bequeath to cousin Sue Phillips five hundred dollars.

Item. All the rest and residue of my estate I give and bequeath to the children of Thos Phillips and J. E. F. Harter.

Lastly. I hereby constitute and appoint F. B. Loftin, of Goldsboro, N. C., to be my lawful executor to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning thereof hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills by me heretofore made and executed.
