 Executors. And I hereby make & ordain my two son
 John & Daniel McMillan Executors of this my last will
 & Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my
 hand & seal, this 18th day of March in the
 Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
 Twenty eight.

In the Name of God amen! I John Threll of the County
 of Sumner & State of North Carolina, being of sound &
 perfect mind and memory, blessed be God, do this
 fourth day of September in the Year of our Lord one
 thousand eight hundred & twenty eight, make &
~~publish~~ ^{publish} this my last will and Testament, in manner
 following. That is to say
 I give & bequeath unto my wife Mary all that
 tract and parcel of land, containing the plantation
 I now live on, also containing a part of the older
 tract, beginning on the bank of Mountain Creek on the
 Gabriel River and run with said line up the an-
 cient lane, leading through to said Gabriel River
 thence with said lane as far off to my old line with
 the direction of said line to hold forever
 I also give unto Mary my wife three negroes, named John
 Daniel & Sarah to have and to hold forever. I also give
 my wife Mary my boy Maria known by the title of the
 children, Mace, and my breeding mare and half
 to hold as known for ever. And I give my wife
 all my household and kitchen furniture as her own

now forever, and also all my working tools & all my
stock of sheep & horse & in need of cattle in price, & my
flock of all her own forever. And all the stock of tobacco
now on hand, grain & every other kind, and also now
growing on the plantation; corn, cotton & every thing else
of every kind, I give unto my wife Mary her own forever.
And the one fifth part of all my money & money demands, now
under me, after my debts are paid, as her own forever.
And I also give my daughter Elsy's children the balance of
the ^{in part} tract of land & one negro girl named Rachel
which is to remain where they now are until the death
of my daughter Elsey. Then they & their increase
if any to be equally divided ^{amongst} ~~between~~ my daughter
Elsy's children. I also give my daughter Elsy's children
fifty dollars in money, to be paid by my Estate to go to the use
of raising them, if needed. I also give unto my daughters
Sarah, Cassy, Ethel & Caroline, the negroes which they
now have in their possession, as they now stand, as their
own & their heirs forever. And I also give my two
daughters Ethel & Caroline, the tract and parcel of
land they now live on, & the whole thereof to be
equally divided between them. I give the balance
of my money after my debts are discharged, to be equally
divided amongst my five daughters before mentioned.
My daughter Elsy's part to go to her children, except ten
dollars, which I give to my daughter Elsy Sutton & Winn
Sutton her husband to dispose of as they think proper, as
their own forever. I also give the balance of my property
not yet mentioned to be equally divided amongst
my children Elsy's children to have her
part. And I hereby make and ordain my
