

In the name of God, Amen: I, the undersigned
Board of Amicable County, North Carolina being
of Samuel Gaspung and necessary, thanks to an
Our Ruling Prudence in the Year this
day of August in the Year one thousand eight
hundred & twenty eight do make, publish & this my
last will & testament hereby revoking all wills & testaments
by me heretofore made, do will & direct that all
my property be disposed of in manner following, viz
To my Son Ephraim H. Board, of that State, I do bequeath
I give bequeath & convey, all the land with all
the rights, hereditaments & appurtenances
thereunto belonging and included & contained within
the following lines or Boundaries, viz. & it shall
begin at a post oak near Daniel Beck's place the
beginning corner of a ^{large} tract of Land conveyed to me
by Gen. Graham at the time of our divorce, ~~from~~
thence from this post oak South with eight degrees
east on the division line between Graham's land
I suppose about four hundred poles, thence on the
line of said line between our Case yard, & Northman's
at the east corner a post oak or large poplar
thence to said post oak or poplar, thence continuing
said division line to a well known corner between
Northman's Land conveyed to me by Gaspung & Daniel
Beck, thence south with the Northman's title
with corner thence with Northman's title South
as far as I have any land, on the east end of
I have none on the west, the line between said Northman's
at the west corner, thence perforce lands belonging
to Daniel Becking, and to children of Gaspung & Daniel
Beck, thence the track on or near the line between

The lands of Sir Roger and his children
and my back length of John Woodcock are bounded
thence by or near poles, with a nearly north of a Stone corner
which stands in clear land & which is a corner of
the Dollinger land and the land conveyed to me
by John Woodcock & them from the post oak near the
Road. Thence south by poles, west by poles, to a gum
on the creek and a little above the mouth of a
ditch then turn South westerly East
To a Black oak in my own land which is a
corner of the land conveyed to me by John Woodcock
near a house and a stone called the little
stone, then South by poles west by poles
towards a pole to a small Bradshaw corner
a Black oak, then you may go on with Bradshaw
line South westerly eight degrees, west one hundred
& fifty odd poles, to Bradshaw other corner a large
post oak on the west side of a Branch & near where
the Road crosses the Branch on the Road from
my house to the corner & from there a large
post oak South forty and west one hundred & fifty
two poles to a pine Adams Street corner then with
Street line South fifty three west one hundred
& fifty or sixty poles, to his other corner a small
post oak near a house on the east side, then
with Street other line South above the branch
bearing it to the west one hundred & fifty poles, to Street
other corner then in a line to the Street corner line
between the two tracks one quarter of a mile or so
to Ephraim & Bradshaw & Pole & Bradshaw &
the other hereafter described & given to my son
Joseph & the others to have the land to the right

Tracts from where this line began, I mean
at the post oak near Daniel Beck, & then & then
the next post oak mentioned near the road I go
on to the end of the line. That is all the land
that belong to the Iron work, west & north west of the
line on the lands given & conveyed to
Ephraim & Robert, & I take in a land conveyed
by Joseph Graham a part of the large tract a
part of the John Andrew tract & land conveyed
by Jacob, Andrew, & Daniel Hedges, Henry Miller &
Jacob Link, Administrators, & George C. & J. P.
Parker, & part of Daniel Beck tract, containing
in the whole between two & three thousand acres
And this land with all the buildings and
tools that are on them & also all waggons, well as
any notes, I have in stock of any kind now
and on said lands together with one half of
my interest which I have in the iron bank and
Limestone lands now in a given. I can do Ephraim
A. Priddy & Robert & Howard, jointly & severally
assign to my sons Alexander, J. M. & Theodore, &
their heirs & assigns, a right in & to the same with
said Ephraim & Robert, to the air furnace & also
to all mines minerals, ores & rocks, that are on said
lands, I give & bequeath to my sons Alexander,
J. M. & Theodore, & jointly the following lands
lying south and east of the lands given to
Ephraim & Robert adjoining land on the
north by the old land owned by James Cunningham
near our quarry and to the north and south west
corner on the west by the line running from
the Daniel Beck tract & the line running from the

I, W. J. Sherman, do hereby declare that I have
to my Son Ephraim & Robert their heirs, Samson
& Right in Common with said Alexander W.
& Sherman to all mine minerals, out & back
that may be on said lands
to William Edwards Hayne & Daniel W. Stoney
who married my daughter Eliza & Harriet
I give & bequeath fifty dollars each, I give and
Bequeath to my Grandson Alexander M. Boardman
Son of John M. Boardman deceased lands on which
back conveyed to me by John Baldridge
John Jones, Samuel Jones, & John Walker
containing between eight & nine hundred acres
provided that in my intention will be that if
my above mentioned Grandson should decease
before he comes of age or die without issue then the
that base I give & bequeath the above mentioned
lands of eight ^{or nine} hundred acres to the children of
my son John M. Boardman to the children of my
daughters Harriet & Mary to be equally divided
between them I give & bequeath to my grand
children the children of my deceased daughter
Eliza D. Hayne whose Christian name was
Grace M. Rebecca Harriet, Franklin & Eliza
Mary & Sarah Martha's two hundred four
hundred dollars to be equally divided between
them & to be paid to them without interest
to serve as they respectively live of a year
more and when this sum can be collected
from the property I have to be sold I give
& bequeath and I require that five hundred
dollars be taken by my executor to be paid

I have devised in the purpose of the Ordinance
made in 1786 & continue to prefer the interests
of which is to go on it may be collected to the
payment of ministers of the Gospel for preaching
Sermons at or near our family Grace yard
which is between William's Ferry & Ferry's Ferry, I mean
that is between Paul Graham's Farm & my house
& where at this time some of our families are buried
I give & bequeath unto my daughter Isabella
Mary Martha & Prunty one half of my tract of land
on the Cataraugus River known by the name of the
Buffalow Head place conveyed to me by Joseph
Stephenson & his children or in lieu thereof two
thousand dollars in bank notes here & to hold out
land or in lieu thereof two thousand dollars
in bank notes her own sole separate & several
use benefit & behoof. I further direct & require
my executor to Reserve money enough to Repair
the family Grace yard & to purchase suitable
monuments for my own my wife & Elizabeth Haynes
Graves, all my lands & real & personal estate
of by this will & testament to be what I do not
have not made stands of conveyance & for which
I have not or do not give Bills of Sale properly
executed together with all my part of the
Farm & Conveyance also all other property in possession
of by this my testament & testament must & do
Require them to be sold & the proceeds of sale
with what notes, accounts & Bonds I have at
the time of my death must when collected
be applied to the payment of my just debts
