

The Following Wills were proved in
Open Court & admitted to Record 1835

In the name of God Amen I, John S. Dutcher
Hallman of the County of Lincoln & State of North
Carolina, being sick & weak of body but of sound
disposing mind & memory, thanks to the God,
but calling to mind mortality of my body, knowing that
it is appointed for all men once to die, do this 16 day of
March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
& thirty three, make & execute this my last will & Testament
in manner & form following, that is to say, principally
first of all I give & recommend my soul into the
hands of the almighty God who gave it, & my body
I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent
Christian burial at the discretion of Executor herein after
named, And as touching such worldly estate wherewith
it hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I give, devise &
dispose of the same in the following manner & form,
having already given to all my children except my
daughter Margaret who is the wife of Henry Smith
such lands & other personal property as I thought to be
their distributive share of my estate, by deed of gift
or otherwise, I therefore by this my last will & Testament
give & bequeath unto my said daughter Margaret
wife of Henry Smith all the land or plantation
whereon the said Henry Smith now lives
which I have surveyed & a Plot on a deed of the same some
years ago by Maxwell Wilson, the aforesaid tract as
surveyed by said Wilson begins at the a post oak on the
side of the road leading to Terrace Mills & runs south
33 or 40 poles to a post oak then to the several other
courses & distances round to the beginning as mentioned
said Plot & Cright twelve acres of the above named tract

of lands which I have given to my Grandson Emanuel H
 Robinson by deed & will having now do with this my last
 will & Testament which have now no more of the same south
 end of said tract adjoining Jacob Hallmans land & it is my desire
 my will & meaning is that the before mentioned tract of land & so the property
 conveyed by my said Son Emanuel Hallman & his heirs and the said Henry
 Smith, & to be by them occupied in a manner so as to be maintenance of
 themselves & families in the use of the same & to be destructive of the land
 or timber beyond what is necessary as now stated the are to use the
 aforesaid land during their natural lives provided no other of either
 of them be taken by death & the surviving one in turn as again
 on the both be dead then in either case I allow my Executor to sell said
 land at public sale on a reasonable credit, the money arising
 that he may get for the same to be equally divided among all
 the children of the said Henry Smith & I will order that
 my son Daniel Hallman do execute this my last will & Testament
 And I do hereby revoke & disannul all & every other former
 will & Executor or Request in me in any wise be or name will
 or bequeathed hereby ratifying this now other to be my last
 will & Testament in which I have now set my
 hand & affixed my seal
