In the name of God I swear this twenty sixth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty two I Archibald Fleming of the co. of Down and State of Maryland being in a reasonable good state of health but getting advanced in years but in perfect mind and memory thanks be given to God for his mercies but calling to mind the frailty of the body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die I trust & recommend myself soul to Almighty God that gave it, me and my body to the dust to be buried after a decent Christian manner not doubting but at the Great Resurrection I shall receive the same by the mighty power of God and as touching my worldly substance that it has pleased God to bestow on me in this life I trust I leave and bequeath to my well beloved wife Nancy Fleming the house we now live in and improvement around it and one hundred acres of land adjoining that improvement to be laid off for her suitable to survey the other four lots as follows as little as possible and at her death that hundred acres to be equally divided and to fall to the other four lots twenty five acres joining each other lot I also leave her all my stock of horses cattle sheep and hogs and lambs all my household furniture of all sorts such as beds & carpets & ornaments I allow her to do with it all at her death as she thinks best Also I leave her all my farming tools and gears as long as she lives and when ^{equally} be divided at her death between my two sons Archibald & James Fleming Secondly I leave & bequeath to my three grandsons Robert Archibald & Andrew Fleming one fourth part of my land to be equally divided between the three boys after their mother Mary Flemings decease as I allow her to have it at her death

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as she lives or remains a widow they are to have
this fourth part where my son John Fleming settled &
to have the two acres that I have my wife that the
twenty five acres have him it at her decease the four
to be laid off according to quantity & quality then that gets
the best land the other lots is to be made equal with them
giving more acres in quantity. I also leave and bequeath
to my daughter Martha Phillips one Dollar & also
I leave & bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Grace one Dollar
I also leave & bequeath to my Daughter Agnes Hadistone one dollar
likewise I leave & bequeath to my son Archibald Fleming one fourth part
of my land where he first settled to be divided as above mentioned
according to quantity & quality. I also leave & bequeath to my
Grandson James Guffy Fleming son of Isaac Fleming one
one fourth part of my land the upper end of my plantation
next to John Allen to be laid off to him as above mentioned
lots. I also leave and bequeath to my Daughter Jane Guffy one
dollar. I also leave & bequeath to my daughter Margaret Stuart
one Dollar. Likewise I leave & bequeath to my son James
Fleming one fourth part of my land where my son John
Fleming settled and to have the hundred acres
I leave my wife as to take the house and barn at my wife's decease
in his twenty five acres his part of that lot as I have the head share
to him at his mother's decease and his lot to be laid off
according to quantity and quality as the above three lots.
I also leave him the wind mill and I leave my son
Archibald my wagon. I leave my son James my Rifle gun
I appoint William Little and Robert Fleming to be my whole
and sole executor and none other. Revoking all other executors
and former wills and testaments & this to be my last will & testa
ment signed sealed and witnessed in the presence of us his
