

The following wills were proved in Open Court & admitted to record 115

In the name of God Amen

I Daniel Singer of the County of Sumter State of Carolina being of sound mind & of legal age do hereby certify that it is my will & desire that after my decease my property which I have pleased God to bestow upon me I leave to my wife Elizabeth Singer & my children in the manner & for the purposes following: My first I leave to my wife Elizabeth Singer her husband & her heirs forever. I also leave to my wife Elizabeth Singer her natural life or widowhood, also all my household & kitchen furniture that I may own at my decease except such as I shall dispose of by that will. She is also to have the use of my dwelling house or such part as may be necessary for her comfort. I give my son Michael Singer the plantation whereon I now live together with all the rest of my land that I now own which he is to give to his plantation. I have given my son Michael a coll but if it does not make a least worth one hundred dollars he is to have as much money as will make up the deficiency. I have given my other son Isaac a coll but if it does not make a least worth that or money to that amount also two ploughs & a good cow. He is to support my wife Elizabeth Singer in a decent & comfortable manner & give her the use of my dwelling house or such part thereof as may be necessary for her convenience during her natural life or widowhood.

My wife Elizabeth is to have a negro or two
two good hinds beasts her choice out of my stock
which she is to keep on the plantation my son
Michael is to keep them for her & to have the use
of them. And should my son Michael neglect or
refuse to support his mother comfortably during
her life or widowhood. Then she is to have
the use of such part of my plantation as
may be competent for her support while she
may tend with her negroes or rent it out.
My son Michael is also to have some sheep out of
my stock as many as will be necessary
to support the family & get a start of stock
of that kind. My wife Elizabeth & her
is also to keep as many cattle out of my stock as she
may choose. I give my daughter Mary
Rudolfe two or three head of sheep if she does
not get them before my decease. It is my will
that she have three hundred dollars in cash
one half of that sum to be given to her out
of my estate at her own disposal after my
decease the other half she is not to have until
after the decease of my wife 5th to my daughter
Elizabeth & her I give three hundred dollars in
cattle one half to be given to her as it can
be raised out of my estate the other half she
is to have after the decease of my mother.
It is my will that she have all her beasts
worth fifty five or seventy dollars two cows
her share of my stock a side saddle & bridle
a shawl and a wash tub a large wash pot
or kettle a dutch oven a cook pot a frying
pan two good beds & furniture a good table
a cushion & a new dress.

a table & two or three head of sheep which are
to be furnished her by my executor unless they are
previously furnished by myself. 8th My Black
Smith tools are to remain here on this place
but ~~any~~ of my servants that choose are to have
the use of them here in the ship at any time
they wish to do any work for themselves.
9th It is my will that after the death of my wife
Elizabeth all the property that I have given
her so that she may live at her death to
be sold & all the balance of my estate not
having specially devised to equally divided
amongst all my children.

I hereby nominate & appoint my son Joseph
& Daniel Singer to execute this my last
will — And I do hereby revoke & annul
I disallow all other & former wills by me
made & executed and I do hereby ratify
publicly & execute this as my last will &
testament — In witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand & affixed my
seal this 28th day of July in the year of
our Lord 1831 — Signed & sealed Packard
