

In the Name of God, Amen
I, Daniel Whitmore of the County of Ninety Six
State of South Carolina, being sick of infirmities
perfect now and memory recovered that it is
appointed for all men and to die do make this my
last will & Testament in this manner and form by
first giving thanks unto my God & Immortal God
who gave it to have a general resurrection
at the last day & my body I desire to be buried
in a decent Christian manner

2nd I will bequeath unto my son John Whitmore
all that part of Land he now lies on for which
I have given him a title & also will the said
John Whitmore one Negro boy named Sanders
3rd I will bequeath unto my son Daniel Whitmore
all that part of Land he now lies on for which
I have given him a title & also will the said
Daniel Whitmore one Negro boy named Andrew
4th I give & bequeath unto my son Henry Whitmore
all that part of Land that I have given him a
title for wherein I also will unto the said Henry Whitmore
all the notes that he owes me in place of a negro boy
5th I give and bequeath unto my son George Whitmore
the lower part of the plantation & meadow which
is divided as follows beginning from a post above
Millers ford the lowest ford in my fields from
thence through the bottom to the draw back of
the middle fence between the bottom & hill land
thence with said fence southward till it
strikes the meadow then across the meadow
the same course to the upland & there to make
a corner & from thence to where the middle fence
joins the fence that runs from the sandy ford below
joining them with the fence by the gate to a red Oak
corner that I have already made there as
North corner to the creek thrown up said creek

between them, I also give the said George
Whittemore a negro boy named Elijah & one horse
that I have already given him named Sicks
6th I give & bequeath unto my son Edward Whittemore
all the remaining part of my plantation
which is the upper part of said plantation

7th I also will & bequeath unto my son Edward
Whittemore & George Whittemore jointly the plantation
a parcel of Land lying ^{on} Rivers side known by
the name of the Upper place. I also will my
son David Whittemore one negro boy named Eli & one
mare named for which he has already received of me

8th I give & bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth wife to
Jacob Copeland a negro girl named Easter
with her increase which she has already received
of me

9th I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Maria
wife to John Setzer one negro girl named Elizy with her increase
which she has already received of me

10th I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Catharine
wife to Jacob Harra one negro girl slave named Matilda
girl slave named Diddy with her increase
which she has already received of me

11th I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Sally
wife to David Gilligan one black girl slave named
Fanny with her increase which I have already given her

12th I will and bequeath unto my Daughter
Rachel wife to David Gilligan one negro girl
named Eliza & also the tract of land that the
said David Gilligan now lives upon provided he the
said David Gilligan pays four hundred
dollars to the rest of my heirs & friends said land

I shall be sold at publick sale
13th instant given my grand daughter Mary
Whittemore Daughter of my son John what I
allow her to have of my Estate.
14th After my will that my son David Whittemore
pay my hundred dollars to the rest of my
heirs the price of wages he gets in without
giving me a note.
15th After my will that all the balance of my
property not sold or otherwise settled in this my
last will and Testament shall remain in my
remaining at my death to be sold at publick
sale & equally divided amongst my heirs.
I have all done, I do make present
this to be my last will & testament, revoke all former
wills & testaments by me made here before
In witness whereof I am, Jerome A. St. John
fixed my seal this 29th day of September 1851
Signed sealed & pronounced fit
the Testator to his last will David Whittemore
and Testament in the presence of
Asalom Miller, Varat
