I, Daniel Whitener ^{Junr} of the County of Kinloch &
State of South Carolina, being sick & of age, do hereby
publish these my last will & testament in the presence of my friends
First I give & bequeath my soul to Almighty God
who gave it, hoping to have a general resurrection
at the last day & my body I desire to be buried
in a decent Christian manner

2nd I will & bequeath unto my son Levin Whitener
all that part of Land he now lives on for which
I have given him a title & also will the said
John Whitener one Negro by name a Vanders

3rd I will & bequeath unto my son Daniel Whitener
all that part of Land he now lives on for which
I have given him a title & also will the said
Daniel Whitener one Negro by name a Andrew

4th I give & bequeath unto my son Henry Whitener
all that part of Land that I have given him a
title for & also will unto the said Henry Whitener
all the notes that he owes me in place of a Negro by

5th I give and bequeath unto my son George Whitener
the lower part of the plantation I now live on which
is divided as follows beginning four poles above
Millers ford (the lowest ford in my field) from
thence through the bottom to the drain ear of
the middle piece between the bottom & upland
thence with said piece Southward till it
strikes the meadow then across the meadow
the same course to the upland & there to make
a corner & from thence to where the middle line
joins the fence that runs from the Sandy ford to the
gate then with the fence by the gate to a red Oak
corner that I have already made thence on a
North Course to the creek thence up said creek

1st I give & bequeath unto my son David William
a negro boy named Elijah four horses
that I have already given him named also
6th I give & bequeath unto my son David William
all the remaining part of my plantation
which is the ^{upper} part of said plantation

7th I also will & bequeath unto my sons David
William & George William jointly the plantation
or parcel of land lying on the river known by
the name of the Upper place. I also will my
son David William one negro boy named Eli from
my own name for which he has already received of me
8th I give & bequeath unto my ^{Daughter} Elizabeth wife to
Joseph Copeland a negro girl named Esther
with her increase which she has already received
of me

9th I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Maria
wife to John Vetter one negro girl named
Eloy with her increase which I have already
given her

10th I give and bequeath unto my Daughter
Catherine wife to Zacharia Tracy one Malatto
girl slave named Peggy with her increase
which she has already received of me

11th I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Sally
wife to David Fitz one Malatto girl slave named
Fanny with her increase which I have already given her

12th I will and bequeath unto my Daughter
Rachel wife to David Sullivan one negro girl
named Eliza & also the tract of land that the
said ^{David} Sullivan now lives on provided he the
said David Sullivan pays four hundred
dollars to the rest of my heirs otherwise said land

13th I have given my grand daughter
Whitener daughter of my son William what
a share he has of me & share

14th It is my will that my son David Whitener
pay me him or a dollar to the rest of my
life in the place of income to get of me without
giving me a note

15th It is my will that all the balance of my
property not with a or a share be to this my
last will and Testament. And there may be
remaining at my death is to be sold at publick
sale & Equally divided amongst my children
share & share all alike, I do make provision
this to be my last will & testament. I revoke & annul
all former wills & testaments by me made here before
