

David Corncards Will.

I David Winard of the County of Lincoln and State of North Carolina bearing in mind the mortality of my body, but being of sound mind and memory do hereby make and contain this as my last Will and Testament - and do hereby bequeath and commit my soul to God who gave it me the hope of Salvation and eternal life through Christ Jesus my Redeemer - and my body to be buried in a decent & Christian manner - and touching such worldly goods and to befall, with which it has pleased God to bless me I do dispose of it in the following manner.

First I will and bequeath to my wife Gadsey her share in the Cornbalger place including the house and as much of the improvements as may be necessary during her widowhood - also two beds and their furniture, and as much of the household and kitchen furniture as she may need - also a mare by the name of Bett, and a horse by the name of Brit. also two cows of her own choice - also as many hogs as two men may judge needful, and as many stock hogs as two men may judge necessary for her family - also as much grain of wheat and corn as may be necessary for the year's supply of provision for her family.

I further give and bequeath to my wife

I further give and bequeath to my wife, ~~the~~ negro
man ~~Anthony~~ during her widowhood; and that at the end
of her widowhood, said negro Anthony to go to my sons
James, and David, equally divided between them.

2nd, I give and bequeath to my son - George W. Heincaid
the plantation on which I now live upon the condition that
he pay two hundred Dollars to my estate.

3rd. I will and bequeath to my son James, one half of
my Ginebarger plantation - also I will and bequeath to my
son James one horse, saddle, and bridle - also one plough
and pair of gears. also one Bed and its furniture. one ~~ct~~
and one shoe. also one cow or ten dollars to buy one -

4th. I give and bequeath to my son David one half
of the Ginebarger plantation - also I will and bequeath
to him, one horse, saddle, and bridle - also one Plough and
pair of gears - also one Bed and its furniture - one ~~ct~~ and
one shoe. also one cow or ten dollars to buy one. the manner
I will the above land shall be divided between my sons
James and David is, that three disinterested men shall

be selected to judge its value and also divide it as to be equal in value to each of them--

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5th. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary, my negro girl Bine upon the condition that should the negro boy which I will to my Daughter Martha die, that the income of the girl Bine, should she live to her age shall go to make her sister Martha equal to herself- also upon the condition that should his increase justify it, one of his children shall go to my son James, and one to my son David-- also I give and bequeath to her one Horse Saddle and Bridle- also one Bed and its furniture- also one cow or Ten dollars to buy one-- also one wheel and one pair of cards, also one table, 1 pot, 1 Skillet, 1 Coffee pot, 1 set of knives and forks, 1 set of Plates, 1 Dish, 1 set of Tea cups and saucers.

6th. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Martha my negro boy Bill, upon the condition that if the girl I have willed to my Daughter Mary should die, that he be so divided between them as to make her sister Mary, equal to herself- also I give and bequeath to her one Horse, Saddle, and Bridle- also one Bed and its furniture. also one cow or Ten dollars to buy one- also one wheel and one pair of cards, also one table, 1 pot, 1 Skillet, 1 Coffee Pot, 1 set of knives and forks, 1 set of Plates, 1 Dish, 1 set of Tea cups and saucers. I will further that should any of these four of my children last named be unfortunate in losing the property willed to them, that the rest do make up the loss.

one Wheel and one Pair of Cards, also one Table, 1000,
1 Coffee Pot, 1 set of Knives and Forks, 1 set of Plates, 1 Dish,
1 set of Tea Cups and Saucers. I will farther that should any
of these four of my Children last named be unfortunate in
losing the property Willed to them, that the rest do make up the loss
is to render them as far as possible equal, according to the rate
of the above named distribution among them. I farther will that
should the negroes Bill and Nine become unruly or unprofitable in
the family, that my Executors shall have the power to hire them
out until my daughters come to age, by giving to them the pro-
ceeds thereof. I farther will that my four last named Children
shall have the expenses borne from time to time while receiving a
good English Education-. I hereby revoke and annul all other and
ordain this as my last Will and Testament-. I hereby appoint my
two sons George W. Kincaid, and James Kincaid Executors of this
my Will - Signed and Sealed this 13th, day of December 1845:

surplus over these legacies above
named shall be equally divided
among all my living Children - the
day and year above named.
