

The following will more proceed on open land
and a submitted to Record. Viz.
In the name of God Amen! I Drury Grissom of
the County of Lincoln & State of North Carolina
being weak in body, but sound in both & mind
of memory; but calling to mind that it is appointed
for all men once to die & do by these presents
make this my last will & testament

First I command my soul to God, who gave
it of my body to the earth to be buried in it.
Christian formerly at the discretion of my
executors. And last to my worldly substance, I will
bequeath as follows. -
First. I will give beneath unto my wife her
lives living off the plantation, on which I live, during her
widowhood, her household furniture & her clothing
and unto my son Miller, I will part of my
plantation. Beginning at a black oak on the old
line & running with it N. W. 65° E 148 poles to a black oak
old corner of house with another old line S 25°
E 124 poles to a white oak, thence with another of
the old lines S 30° W 163 poles to a Hickory. thence
with another old line S. 65. SW. 11° poles to a
black oak on old line, thence a division line
N. 50 E. 134 poles to a position in an old field near
the big road. thence nearly with the big road N.
59 W. 916 poles to the beginning. Also will entitle
my personal property not otherwise valued. Viz.
An Mop. I will bequeath the remainder of my lands
not heretofore willed. The rest of my children not
married, have already got all my Estate that I intended for
them. I nominate & appoint Isaac Holland & Miller
W. Grissom my executors. And test in any where. I have
set my hand & seal this 26th day of November 1827.

At the Muster of Col. Union, that he might stay
December in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight
hundred & twenty eight, I, Michael Glounger of
Lincoln County State of North Carolina, being in
a perfect state of mind & memory, make to the God
for this Muster, - But, being affectionately willing
to mind the mortality of the body & provoking that it
appropriate for all men made to see, First the command
my soul to Almighty God that you it me, and my
body to the Earth to be buried after death, a Christian
manner, not doubting but at the great resurrection, I shall
receive the same by the mighty power of God, and
astonishing, my mortal substance that it hath please God to
bestow on me in this life, I leave & bequeath in the following
manner & form, first, I leave & bequeath to my wife Elizabeth
Barbara Glounger, all the balance of my land where my
house stands, after my son Michael Glounger gets one
hundred & ten acres where he now lies, and my son
Henry Glounger gets one hundred off the other end
where he now lies. I leave it her during her life & wid
our house. Also I leave her one cow, her choice of
my stock, all my beds, bedsteads & furniture, all
my sheep pasture & all my household and kitchen
furniture of every description excepting my clock &
one negro girl named Suckey during her life, & at her
death to be sold & equally divided among my children
as follows. John Glounger, Thos. Glounger I am
met, Barbara Parker or her heirs, I allow five dollars
Pounds like her, Michael Glounger, Henry Glounger
David Glounger, I allow all my children an equal
share in the price of the negro girl, except Barbara
Parker, then I allow five dollars. I leave
my son David Glounger all the balance of my land
where I now live, supposed to be one hundred &
fifty acres, to have it at his mother's death, I also
allow my clock, house, balance of cattle, though

and hogs and all my other property of every description mentioned in my will to be sold at my death, & after my debts all is paid, to be equally divided between my wife Barbara, John Gilmer's wife Mary Rose Mary Schmit, Betsy Lile, Michael Clemons her husband & Daniel Glouster. I appoint that Michael Clemons to be my sole and sole Executor and no other, Accounting Executors & former wills & Testaments and this to be my last Will & Testament.

In the Name of God Amen! - I Henry Bengal of the County of Lincoln in the State of North Carolina being of sound and perfect mind & memory before God, do this 18th day of December Anno Domini 1828 make and publish this my last Will & Testament in manner following that is to say, first I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Esther all my notes & movable property except fifty dollars, which I bequeath to my grandson Henry, son of John Bengal, which is to be laid out for his schooling. My wife Esther shall also have privilege to live in the dwelling house where I now live. My son John Bengal shall find her sufficient meat, drink and cloathing during her natural life. After her decease the said John Bengal shall have all that is in her possession, except money & notes, which if there be any remaining shall be divided in these equal parts, the one third to my daughter Mary Lile's children, the one third to my daughter Mary May Johnson & the one third to my step daughter Barbara Brad-
