

Warranty Sessions 1862

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J. W. Schenck. Will

I David W Schenck of the Town of Lincolnton & State of Ohio bequeath being of sound mind & disposing mind & memory, do make and ordain this to be my last Will and Testament hereby revoking a former Will by me made, to wit I will and direct my body if practicable to be buried by the side of my deceased & beloved wife Susan, in a plain Walnut or Cherry Coffin and a Slab of Marble similar to the one over my deceased wife's grave, to be procured and such inscription as my Children may desire, to be placed on it & further that the Brick foundation now to Slab of my deceased wife's grave be removed and to be replaced with a good heavy Stone foundation & a similar one to wit of Stone placed to my own grave. The expenses for all of which to be first paid out of my Estate by my Executors

I further Will to my Son in law James Schenck my Blacks Bille as a memento and also I give unto my daughter Barbara & Benjamin his wife all the House hold & Kitchen furniture. She took with her at the time she left me to commence house keeping. I further I have given her my Buggy with a Trip to it & the harness & harness going to it

I further Will & bequeath unto my son David Schenck the Chairman known as his, the one I have used for myself known as his mother & my Secretary, also 3 beds including furniture & bedsteads, and also the House hold & Kitchen furniture. I now have also my family Bille & all my Medical & Literary & Scientific Books, and all the Library of books purchased for him from time to time also my Silver watch & gold Key, & Guns & accoutrements also my

Life Books, and all the Library of books purchased for him from time
to time also my Silver watch & gold key & guns & accoutrements also my
Horse Saddle, I have not. Will be to my daughter Barbara.

I further will that my property not above named or hereafter expressed be
equally divided between my daughter Barbara & Pontius and my son
David Schenck according as they can agree to the valuation of the same
but should they not be able to agree as to the valuation they may either
select two men & these two thus selected, to select a third who shall value
the same, or put it to sale, & divide the money arising from the sale equ-
ally between them. I further will that out of my Estate a neat pocket
bill be purchased for each of my Grand Children and their names
respectively be printed on the back of each & to be delivered to each as
it arrives at the age of ten years, as a memento of love & affection from
their grand father said bills not to cost up more than two dollars or
more than five dollars & extending to said Grand Children as long
as living at the time of my death; I appoint my son David Schenck
son in law James C. Pontius Executors of this my last Will Testament

dollars together with a note on J C Jenkins for two hundred and
fifty dollars signed & sealed in
presence of us the day & date above
