In the name of God & Jesus I Edward Mellor in
the state of S Carolina & County of Sumter being weak
in body but of sound mind and memory doth call to
God to make this my last will and testament in the
the following manner:

Item My wish and desire is that all my just debts and
funeral expenses be paid.

Item I will and bequeath to my son John Mellor two
notes which I hold in my hands for Thirty five
Dollars each dated the eight day of June 1807.

Item I will & bequeath unto my son Jonathan Mellor
all that tract of Land that I now live on & a neighboring
of nine acres.

Item I will and bequeath unto my son in law & daughter
Henry Lewis & Elizabeth Lewis One dollar each, and at the
of my beloved wife in case she durrie me, I allow her to
have a part of my wife's clothing, say One red Cloak &
One Calico Gown.

Item My will is that after all my funeral expenses
and all just debts is paid, that my Grandson James
Mellor, shall have Twenty Dollars if so much be left.

Item It is my will and I do hereby ordain Constable
appoint my wife and Neighbor James Glancy
& my Son Jonathan Mellor, and my friend John
Neely, executors of this my last will & testament, & I
do hereby utterly revoke, and annul, every other testa-
ment, will or bequeath, by me heretofore made published
and declaring, this and no other, to be my last will &
testament signed sealed published & declared by me
the said Edward Mellor in the presence of
