perfect mind & memory, blessed be God for his mercies towards
me do this eleventh day of Nov. 1828 publish & declare this to
be my last will & testament in the following manner Viz —
1st I recommend my soul to God who gave it & my body
to be interred in a Christian like manner 2^d I give and
bequeath unto my nephew Samuel Thomas, all my Real Estate
and my three year old filly and my Colt — one bed & clothing —
I give & bequeath unto my nephew Mary Walker my bed
paddle & one horse — 4th I give & bequeath unto my sister
Margaret Wilson one cow my fine headle my clothing and
all my property not heretofore mentioned —
And I do hereby declare this to be my last
will & testament & do hereby appoint my Elizabeth & Wilson (2^d)
worthy friends Moses Wilson & Thomas Pierce
Executors of this my last will & testament this day
& year first above written

The foregoing will was proved in open Court by the oath of

Be it known to all whom it may concern that
I Samuel Adams of the State of North Carolina County
of Lincoln, being in a weak state of health but of sound
mind & memory do on the 8th day of February 1830
make, ordain constitute, this to be my last will and
testament and of the good things of this life which God
& his providence, has bestowed to me I bequeath in the
following manner, first I recommend my soul to God
who gave it and my body to be laid in a decent Chris-
tian manner and knowing that I have a large family
I bequeath this tract or parcel of land that I
know lies on, also a tract or parcel of land of one
hundred & twenty acres, which joins this tract also
all my stock of horses & cows & sheep & stock of
every kind also my household & kitchen furniture &
negro slaves Wills & Jack & filly, also my tools & ves-
sels & farming tools, to my beloved wife Margaret to live
& support on & to school my children as long as she
remains a widow. but if my beloved wife Margaret
change her way of life by marrying to any other
man I then bequeath or appoint all my lands or parcels
of ground to be divided into three equal shares and then
I do bequest of my lands to my beloved wife Margaret one
third part and the other two thirds I bequeath to my children
to be equally divided between them also all the negro
slaves they may have at that time & all the stock of
horses & cows & sheep & stock of every kind to be equally
