The following wills proved in open Court
& admitted to record

I Henry Sumner of the State
of North Carolina & Lincoln County being
frail in body & knowing that it is appointed
for all men once to die, but being of a
sound & disposing mind & wishing to dispose
of the property that it has pleased god to
bless me with in this world do hereby
make this my last will & Testament in
the manner & form following Viz-

1st My son Henry Sumner having re-
ceived a good tract of land & other property
from me it is my will that he receive
no more of my estate

2nd My son Isaac Sumner having received
a good tract of land & other property from me
it is my will that he receive no more of my estate

3rd My Daughter Catherine Finger having
received a good tract of land & other property
from me it is my will that she receive no
more of my estate

4th My Daughter Mary Sumner having received
a good tract of land & other property from me
it is my will that she receive no more of
my estate

5th My son John Sumner having received
a good tract of land & other property from
me it is my will that he receive no more
of my estate

6th My daughter Susannah Finger having
received a good tract of land & other prop-
erty from me it is my will that she re-
ceive no more of my estate -

My daughter Eliza with the tract of land I
hereby will to her son & daughter, son James
Sumner & daughter Rebecca Sumner that part
of land lying on the south East corner of my plan
thence beginning at a Hickory tree Moors corner
thence to a Gum. Wiley Hollmans corner & Daniel
Sumners corner thence south with the Hallmons line
to Hills line thence to the beginning. & a piece
of pine land lot 104 lying between Daniel
Sumners & Wiley Hollmans being a part of the tract
which I have deeded to Wiley Hallmons
I further will & bequeath unto my daughter
Anna Sumner a piece of land lying on the east
side of my old tract of land beginning at a
black Oak near the place where the old gate
formerly hung thence with Morris & Blackburns
line to the Hickory corner Moors corner thence
south to a Black Oak thence Daniel Sumners
line west to a Black Oak thence to the begin-
ning. And a tract of pine land lying on
Lockarts Creek joining lands of Elizabeth Fingers
beginning at a Black Oak Fingers corner thence
with said line to Fingers old corner thence
across the Mill pond to a stone heap Fingers
corner thence to Cousins corner thence to the
beginning. & I further will is that my
grand daughter Fanny Hallmons is to have
sixty dollars out of my estate that is of the
money arising from the sale of my loose
property. And I do hereby appoint my
trusty friend Daniel Sumner & Henry Fingers
my Executors to execute this my last will &c

Executors of this my last will & Testament. In
