Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors

I Philip Thr of the County of Lincoln in the
State of North Carolina being sick and weak
in body but of perfect, sound and disposing mind
and memory do make & ordain this my last will
& testament in the manner & form following
(Viz) - First I give my Son Philip the
plantation that I now live on containing about
200 acres to him for ever. I also give him a
Wagon, Iron Harrow all the horse gears, killing
bed, a horse of one grass size choice of a plough
all the ironing tools
Second I give unto my wife Susannah two good
beds two chairs & shap all the kitchen furniture
the young son & her all the money she shall
have, she shall have possession of the house
during her widowhood, if she should marry again
then this property shall be sold, equally divided
among all my children

Thirdly the son Philip shall pay to my wife 150
dollars as she wants it he shall ^{give} ~~pay~~ ^{her} ~~the~~
10 pound of sugar, 4 pound of coffee, 30
bushels of corn, 10 bushels of wheat he shall find
one hog to fatten, he shall find her land for
flax cotton and potatoes as much as thought
sufficient after her death or widowhood, then
her property shall be sold & the money equally
divided among all my children, also 50
dollars not much more if any but shall be
divided among all my children. I therefore

two acres of land and also the Still & tubs
of stock the right for which he shall receive
after my decease I also give and bequeath unto
my daughter Sarah Belchunt fifty acres which
my son Abraham Belchunt may have
and above what she has already received from
me in my lifetime I also give and bequeath
unto my son Abraham Belchunt his heirs for
ever One hundred acres of land the right for
which he shall receive after my decease with
the exception that he pay unto his sister Sarah
Belchunt the above mentioned fifty dollars in
such property as will suit him to pay and
will suit her to have need it is my will
that after my decease all my property that
I may then be possessed of without impinging
upon my wife's legacy may be sold and the
proceeds thereof made up my debts and
funeral expenses first paid among all my chil-
dren Adam and Christian excepted and
shall hereby my executors and administrators

any having and duly to be done Daniel Polick
and David Polick to the Executors of this my
last will and Testament hereby looking all
former wills or bequests by me made as
done ratifying and confirming this to be
my only last will and Testament in writing
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
