Synod in the State of North Carolina, being
weak in body, but of sound mind and memory
calling to mind the uncertainty of life & that
it is appointed for all men Once to die, do this
14th day of June in the Year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred and twenty five
make and publish this my last will and Testament
in the manner following (viz)

January 6th 1825³

my son Ezekiel Sullivan the ~~entire~~ sole executor
of this my last Will and Testament, & do hereby
revoke & disannul all former wills & Testaments
made by me & declare this & these above to be
my last Will & Testament
