

Joseph Wingates Will

I Jesse Wingate of the County of Lincoln State of North Carolina being of sound Mind & Memory, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this my last Will and Testament in manner and following that is to say.

First That my Executor (hereinafter named) shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relations & friends and pay all funeral expences, together with my Just debts, howsoever due to whomsoever owing out of the money, that may first come into his hands as a part or parcel of my Estate.

Second I give and devise to my daughter Martha wife of J. M. Sullivan one fourth of all my real and personal estate to her and the heirs of her body.

Third I give and devise to my son N. D. Wingate one fourth of my Real and personal Estate.

Fourth I give and devise to my son Thomas D. Wingate one fourth of my Real and personal Estate.

Fifth I give and devise to my daughter Jane one fourth of my Real and personal estate.

And lastly - I do hereby constitute and appoint my trusty friend J. M. Smith my lawful Executor to all intents & purposes to execute this my last will and Testament according to the true intent & meaning of the same, and every part and clause thereof, hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made, I witness whereof I the said Jesse Wingate do hereunto set my hand and seal this 7th day of April 1862.

Daniel M. Weavers Will

State of N. Carolina, Greene County, March 21st 1862

I, Daniel M. Weaver of said County do make this my last Will & Testament.

1st I devise and bequeath to my wife Elizee M. Weaver and her heirs forever
all my Real Estate, which consists of two tracts of Land lying in the County of
Lincoln. One tract contains about 120 acrs. and lies on the waters of Howard
Creek and adjoins the lands of David Hoover and others, and was purchased
by me from Elizabeth Shoup the boundaries of which tract are mentioned in
the deed of the said Elizabeth Shoup bearing date on the 3rd day of April 1839.

The other tract also lies on the waters of Howard Creek and contains about
55 1/2 acrs and adjoins the lands of Saml. Eaman S. W. Mauney & Levi Houser.
And was purchased by me from Samuel Eaman and the boundaries of which
are mentioned in the deed of the said Eaman dated 4th day of February 1861.

2nd I do hereby will & bequeath unto my said wife forever all my personal
Estate, to wit all my Cattle, Hogs, all my household & kitchen furn-
-ture, farming tools all notes and accounts due
