Sincerely her declaration & bequeath unto her
& her heirs forever. 3^d It is my will that my lands
& all my property be sold by my executor
& that after the payment of all my just debts
& the above bequests the monies remaining from
such sale shall be equally divided among my
four daughters Sally, Elizabeth, Margaret & Mary
Lately I nominate & appoint my son Alexander Davis my
friend Robt Solomon my executor of this my last will
& testament & charging & committing all former wills &
testaments by me heretofore made concerning testating
this to be my last will & testament in witness whereof
I have heretofore set my hand & seal the 6th day of
Oct in the year of our Lord 1824 Signed Seal & Seal
published & declared in the presence of John Davis (seal)
