

The following will be presented in Open
Court & admitted to record

In the name of God Amen
I John Huffman of the County of Hancock State of
Maine having been seized with some
mind & memory but feeling that it is
appointed for all men once to die do by these presents
make this & that only my last will & testament
first I recommend my soul to God who gave it
my body to the earth to from whence it came
to be buried in a decent funeral the discharge of
my Executors hereafter appointed
I will & bequeath to my son John Huffman
all the land I hold or own on the North side of the Creek
on which I now live including mills, mill pond
I further will unto him my negro Bryan
I further will to my son Joseph Huffman all the
land I own on the South side of said creek & my crop
including the improvement on which he now lives
the Eliza Whoddy place & the nearly four acre
tract called the Mills Place
I further will & dispose of my land on the South
side of the South fork of the Katahdin River
including the mill & improvement called the Long
Huffman Mill & the Hammetton place or where
John Hammetton lived & including the little place
where Golly Harris lives in short all the land I
own down there on said fork to be divided between
my son John Huffman & the six sons of my
son Jonas viz. Eli, Michael, Jacob, Simon, Peter
& John in full of a division here to commence
at the mouth of a branch called the Cobb branch
I to run up the said branch to its head then a
straight line nearly north to the old Patent line
where it crosses a deep Hollow then all on the
side of said line next to Thomas Hannah, land
I will & bequeath to my son John Huffman
& that part on the other side of said line will
I bequeath unto the said six sons of my
son Jonas Huffman viz.

I further will & bequeath unto the said heirs, or
 at before the plantation on which Isaac Hays
 now living but said plantation is to be sold out as
 follows without a division until or at the discretion
 of my executors that is my executors are to be the
 Judges when to give them less for the said
 land & the rest of said place to be counted as part
 of my Estate I further will that my negro man
 this wife Fanny, be in his house under the care
 of my son Peter but it is to be understood that
 those two negroes are not to be sold & they get
 help & said Peter is to maintain them
 & the remainder of my property not withstanding
 sold & equally divided amongst my heirs after
 my funeral expenses & burial debts are paid
 & I further will that Daniel Hoffman pay no
 interest on the debts he owes me I further will
 that my son Joseph Hoffman has no interest
 nor principal in his notes, that they be given
 up to him I further appoint my sons
 Daniel & Peter Hoffman my executors of
 this my last will & testament in witness
 whereof I Peter Hoffman do hereunto set
 my hand & seal this 7th day of September
 1802 published & acknowledged
