

In the name of God amen. I John Lynn
of the County of Lincoln & State of Massachusetts being
weak in body but of perfect mind & memory & call
to mind the mortality of my body & knowing that
it is appointed for all men once to die, do, this the
first day of October in the year of our Lord 1827
make, constitute & ordain this my last will & testa-
ment, in manner & form following. I first
recommend my soul to God, who gave it to me.
Secondly I recommend my body to the earth from
whence it came to be buried in a christianlike
manner at the expense of my estate. Thirdly I
give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Rachel
Lynn one tract of land wherein I now live containing
two hundred acres with all the appurtenances
therunto belonging during her natural life &
widowhood. I also give my wife all my farm
ing tools and all my household furniture, except
the bed & furniture belonging to each of my
daughters Mary Lynn Rachel Lynn & Sally
Lynn. I also give my wife all my stock of hogs
for the use of her & family. I also give my wife
all my stock of cattle, except one cow and
one calf of my daughters, Mary Rachel &
Sally Lynn, & one two year old heifer I will
to my grand daughter Maria Lynn the above
mentioned tract of land after the death of
Mrs Rachel Lynn is to be equally divided
among Mary, Rachel & Sarah Lynn. I also give
my wife one more vine of the death of
Mrs Lynn the 10 more is to be & the money
arising from the same is to be equally divided
between Mary Rachel & Sally Lynn. I also
give unto my son Henry Lynn fifty seven acres
of land wherein he now lives during his natural

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life and at ~~the~~ his death to fall to my grandson
John Williamson Lynn except that some that
I will to my grand son John Lynn. I also give
my grand son John Williamson Lynn five acres
of land adjoining the above. I give to my daughter
Mary Lynn one large plot. The rest of the plot
will to the use of the family during our joint life & then
divided between Mary & Rachael Lynn. I will to my
son Henry Lynn one rifle gun. I will to my grand son
John Williamson Lynn one musket & one sword. I
will that two tracts of land one on Indian Creek
containing two hundred acres & one on Big Creek
containing one hundred acres be sold and
the money arising from the same go to defray my
debts & the balance to be equally divided between
my wife & children Mary Lynn. Mary Lynn &
Mary Lynn & Rachael Lynn. And I appoint
Lightfoot William my executor to act & do for
me as tho I was present. I do hereby revoke and
disannul all former testaments, declaring this to
be my last will & Testament in the presence of
witnesses in his presence & the presence of each
other have hereunto subscribed our names.
