In the name of God Amen I John McCoy of the State of  
South Carolina formerly of Lincoln being by good health  
of sound mind but declining to mind the mortality of my body  
the certainty of death & the uncertainty of time it may happen so  
shortly make certain & estable this to my last will & testament  
witnessed first & equally my soul to go to heaven &  
body to the earth hence in due season hereinafter  
at the discretion of my children helping for & finding place through  
the ministry of the churches & touching such worldly  
estate where with it shall please God to help me & dispose  
of in the following manner in that all my just debts  
funeral expenses & fine & paid off & give the equal to  
my beloved wife Mary McCoy during her natural life the  
use of the plantation above described & all my other property  
to be evenly apportioned between them & my other property  
full power as trustee to have an outright during the  
lifetime of my wife & upon her death to see that  
none of the property is wasted & destroyed  
I give & bequeath to my daughter Anna McCoy  
mother deceased negro boy named Monroe & I give & bequeath  
unto my daughter Rachael or her mother, death a negro  
girl named Fanny & I give & bequeath unto my  
son John D. Moody & his mother, death the plantation  
whether now here or a plantation by a slave named Cudjo  
but after my wife's death my negro man Jacob & negro  
woman Fanny I give & bequeath to my daughter Betty  
Rachael McCoy, Palma a one to each as they may agree  
concerning the same to pay to my estate to men as each  
negro may be taking at his or her own more than the  
value of the small negro I have called to my other

7th It is my wish after my death to my wife  
bequeath my estate that they be equally divided among all my children  
8th & my wife, clear to all other property in the same specially  
dispersed of which I may die seized. Differed, if allowed  
not to be left but to be equally distributed among all my children  
especially to such valuation & proportionate of such sum as they  
may choose for that purpose. In testimony whereof I have  
hereunto set my hand & countersigned by John Wood, to his last will  
testament the present day of August 1826 signed the same  
as witness there to in the presence of us both & each other  
I Graham Ward John Wood *(read)*

Graham  
John Ward having recurred to the foregoing will  
stated in his place in my presence by his attorney  
made by the death of the negro girl named Sophia which  
I gave to my daughter, Susan as her negro children  
uninherited land. I do therefore accept the following as valid  
as part of the said will I give the quantum to my daughter  
Susan or my wife, daughter the slaves of the negro children  
which were bequeathed in the foregoing will as aforesaid unless  
granted by my last will & testament I have been to a part of  
my last will & testament this 9th March 1821 signed sealed  
plummeted by John Wood & John Ward as a part  
of his last will & testament in presence of me.

April 15 1820 Having recurred the foregoing will & codicil  
hereinafter duly made the following alterations the negro boy  
called Lewis & sold to my daughter Susan I wrote & do hereby  
will bequeath the sum of £100 to my son John Wood in consideration  
he pays to my daughter Susan the sum of £100 or less than that  
is of the said boy named Lewis until the death of my wife  
the place of the said boy known full payment to my wife  
caught either the negro child above referred to after her death  
Son and master, slave in proportion of the above codicil  
the negro child to be their heir for the sum of £100 or less than that  
which there to be paid to my daughter Susan & her heirs to be well  
and the sum in proportion for the last will

My wife, devoted all other property in this in specially  
dispensing of which I may also say I dispossessed, I allow  
not to do so but to be equally divided among all my children  
equally to such distribution & appropriate provision as they  
may choose for that purpose. In testimony whereof I have  
subscribed my hand & seal this 1st day of August 1826

I John Bloody having received the foregoing will &  
desirous having taken place in my property deceased may  
made by the death of the negro girl named Sophie which  
I gave to my daughter Anna as her attorney's children  
remained lone & therefore accepted following devise  
as part of the said will I give the negro to my daughter  
Anna or my wife, death her executors of the 2 negro children  
whereas I am since the foregoing will was made in view  
of said Sophie deceased in mind, whereof I have been unto it by  
hand & affixed my seal & pronounced the above as a part of  
my last will testament this 2d March 1831 signed sealed  
pronounced by John Bloody & John Bloody as a part  
of his last will testament in presence of

April 15 1834 Having re-considered the foregoing will & desirous  
hereinafter to make the following alterations in the negro boy  
called Bloody. Belong to my daughter Anna I revoke this hereby  
will & give the said boy to my son John Bloody in consideration  
he pay to my daughter Anna one thousand dollars that  
is of the same boy, unredressable until the death of my wife  
the place of the salary money shall bequeath to my  
daughter Anna the negro child above named to after her death  
Anna's master, choice or purvance of the slave agent  
the negro child to her when present the foregoing will &  
especially thereof being paid to John Bloody his sign & sealed &  
pronounced the same day presented up to his last will  
testament who witnessed the same to be the true record of
