In the name of God Amen. I John  
Wilkinson of the County of Lincoln & State of North  
Carolina being of Sound Mind & Memory blessed  
be God for the same do make & publish this my  
last will & Testament in manner & form as followeth  
I give & bequeath to my loving Letty Wilkin-  
-son her own bedding & furniture & all my deep  
furniture & the chairs belonging to the house & one  
chest that she brought with her & wash pot &  
two of the warts. Then I two Acres of the choicest  
& best land & one small plot & two cows of her  
choicest and five head of sheep & three breeding  
sows & three hogs and one horse of her choice  
the Grey horse excepted and three Negroes Lucy  
& Martha & Mattie during her life time or widowhood  
& water pair & Churn and I also give to my wife  
Letty the upper part of my plantation where I live  
including my buildings and running down to a  
line of a tract of land that I bought from James  
McKeeble the upper line during her life or  
widowhood and two pair of gears for a horse  
with two bar shears plows & two shovel plows &  
Coffee Mill & the frying pan and if Mattie  
don't be obedient to his Mistress the Executors  
to sell him to the highest bidder & I give to  
my wife Letty on table five dogs & shovel and  
one tye and Cradle and mowing to the choicest  
choicest & dung shovel & spade and one Iron tooth  
Cotton Harrow and cutting Reap and Knives and  
one Mattock and two axes & two hoes her choice  
and for the support of my family sixty bushels  
of wheat and her seed wheat Coward and all  
the Bacon for this present year also

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I give to my youngest daughter Martha  
 one bed and furniture. I give to my  
 daughter Isabella one bed & furniture and  
 one chest and twenty five dollars to my two last  
 named daughters each to make them equal  
 with the others that is married off. Also  
 I give to my son Francis one hundred & fifty  
 acres of the lower end of my plantation  
 joining lands of Gabriel Merrill & Gilbert  
Milligan and others not to interfere with  
 the aforesaid lands until he is wife till  
 after her death. Also I give to my son  
Francis the Gray horse saddle & bridle and  
 one bed & furniture. Also I give to my daughter  
Margaret fifty dollars to make her equal with  
 the rest of my daughters. I also give to my  
 daughter Elizabeth one Negro man named  
Anderson valued at six hundred dollars  
 by her paying two hundred & thirty six dollars  
 back. Also give to my daughter Sarah Emily  
 one Negro man named Wilson valued at  
 six hundred dollars by her paying two hundred  
 & thirty six dollars back. Also give to my  
 daughter Dorcy one Negro woman named  
Mary and her increase valued at five hundred  
 dollars by her paying one hundred & thirty  
 six dollars back. Also give to my son  
Alexander one Negro man named Joe  
 by paying fifty dollars back. Also give to  
 my daughter Mary Ann one Negro girl  
 named Susan and her increase valued at  
 three hundred dollars. I also give to my son  
Francis one Negro girl named Lucinda  
Tuffin and her increase. I also give to

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My daughter Margaret Three hundred & sixty four dollars in Money to be paid two years after they get them in possession. The Negroes & horses is to remain on the plantation this season till the crop is brought in if any of them don't take them at the valuation they may be put to sale, at the death of my wife Lettie the land & the Negro Slaves to be sold at publick sale & to be equally divided amongst all my children except my son Francis who is to have One hundred dollars more than any of the rest. And I also give my wife Lettie One Womens Saddle and any of my property not willed to be put to sale at the expiration of this year. I also give to my wife Lettie one Iron tooth Harrow to be sold at her death with the rest of the property.

I also give One Walnut table to the use of the family till my daughter Isabella moves away & then it is to be my daughter Isabella's property. (My wind Mill to remain at this place for the use of my family) at the death of my wife I allow Lucy & Charles to choose their home amongst any of my children. The property I willed to my wife except my lands & Negroes I allow to be at her own disposal. I also give to my daughter Martha Ann The pet calf & the two hares that I willed to my wife at her death to go to my son Francis
