be to God. Do this stately first day of May in the year
of our Lord One Thousand Eight hundred and Twenty
four make and published his my last will and
testament in manner following that is to say.

First I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Margaret
all my negroes which I have and all their increase
during her life time. as long as she will go in my bed
and all the bay horses both and stallions and the black
horse Jack. and also a waggon which John Glaser
wrote me and all the old iron that is here to go
on it and for the bedding of the iron that will be
a wanting. and for the riding of it by me to save
that which out of the estate belongs to it, also the wagon
gear for two horses and all the ploughs and harrows
and also all the dogs and three beds her choice and
all the clothes for winter. The cows and calves
her choice and all the hogs the best. and cattle
and also eight steers. two spanneds wheel and burrell
and I do hereby make and ordain my will
named John Wolfgang the Executor of this my last
will and Testament in witness whereof I the said
Joseph Dillingers have to this my last will
and testament set my hand and seal the day & year
first above written.
