Brevard my plantation in the District and state aforesaid known by the name of the Taylor Tract containing between six and seven Hundred acres more or less and purchased by me from my Brother Theodore W. Brevard together with all the Horses Mules cattle Hogs sheep plantation tools and utensils of every description and appurtenances belonging to or is in any way attached to the said plantation or is necessary to conduct the business of the same - the provisions for its support as well as the crop which may be growing on the said premises all of which I give to my said wife to her and her heirs forever.

I give to my said wife Benjamin the following negroes Tom Henry aged about thirty one Sam fifty Parker thirty three Dacy forty five Ephraim forty one Jim Twenty eight Amos nineteen Edwin twenty two Abram ten Albert seven Dacy twenty three and her children Peter and Sepia Sally twenty seven and her children Sarah eight Dick four fifty three and infant Ben Phillips thirty five Beck sixteen and her Phillips children Jerry & infant Mary sixteen Rosanna thirteen & dice two together with the

all such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to
bless me with do make and ordain this my last will &
testament in manner following, that is to say

If I give to my beloved wife Beziah G. Brewards
my plantation in the District and state aforesaid
known by the name of the Taylor tract containing
between six and seven Hundred acres more or less and
purchased by me from my Brother Thaddeus W. Brewards
together with all the Horses Mules cattle Hogs sheep
plantation tools and utensils of every description and
appertaining belongs to or is in any way attached
to the said plantation or is necessary to conduct the business
of the same or the provisions for its support as well
as the crop which may be growing on the said premises,
all of which I give to my said wife to her and her heirs forever.

If I give to my said wife Beziah the following negroes
Tom Henry aged about thirty one Sam fifty Parker thirty
three Dacy forty five Ephraim forty one Sam Twenty eight
Amos nineteen Edinborough twelve Abram ten Albert
seven Lucy twenty three and her children Peter and Jose

wife I give same to her and her heirs forever If I give to my

My death and seven per cent interest shall be allowed on said amount from the expiration of the first twelve months until the said two thousand dollars shall be paid over to my said wife his Heirs assigns.

Carolina amounting to between seven and eight Thousand Acres, together with my New Manufacturing establishment my saw and Grist mill and all that appertains thereto or is in any wise connected with and attached to the same as a part or parcel of the estate and establishment including all my rights and interests in the one bank since Juarez Miller and Minerals in said county and State, I also give my said brothers all my stock in North Carolina consisting of Horses Mules cattle Hogs & sheep as well as all my Plantation tools and utensils my wagons and carts I Blacksmith tools and belongs or is attached to the said premises

be to her and her heirs forever

Brouard all my landed and real estate in Lincoln County
N. Carolina amounting to between seven and eight
thousand acres, together with my new Manufacturing
establishment my saw and Grist mill and all that
appertains thereto or is in any wise connected with
or attached to the same as a part or parcel of the estate
and establishment including all my rights and interests
in the ore bank lime quarry timber and minerals in
said county and state, I also give my said brothers
all my stock in North Carolina consisting of Horses
Mules cattle Hogs sheep as well as all my Plantation
tools and utensils my wagons and carts I Blacksmiths
tools and ~~belongings~~ belongs or is attached to the said premises

- (19) I give my Gold watch chain and seal to my friend and relation Mr. See Davis of Mecklenburg North Carolina
- (20) I give my Gold Headed Hickory walking stick to Joseph McClain son of my relative P. D. McClain so & Decade

(213) Whatever debts I may owe I desire may be paid by the sale of the iron or land at my factory in North Carolina and in the receipt of what may arise from the collection of the bonds notes and accounts due me.
