In the name of God amen I ~~James~~
Wyllie of the County of Lincoln & State of North Car-
olina. Being of Sound mind and perfect memory
blessed be god for the same do this 14th day of
February 1833. Constitute Ordain & publish to be
my last Will & Testaments in these words & form
following. To wit. I first bequeath my body
to the earth from whence it ~~came~~ taken to be
buried in a decent Christian Manner & my
Soul to god who gave it & will that all my
just debts burial & expenses be paid first

& give & bequeath to my beloved wife Susan
-nah two beds & the nature of her choice of my bed
room Chest & also my dresses & as much of my
furniture as she wishes to keep for her use &
also of the pots & other kitchen furniture as
she wants for her use & also one Cow & Cattle in
Choice of my Stock & Seventy dollars in Money

I Give & bequeath to my beloved son David
Wyllie my plantation where I now live on Con-
-taining two hundred & Ninety acres also the
& Vepels to him & his heirs forever & also my
Wagon & Wind Mill. And my son David is
to furnish his mother yearly with the following
articles. To wit. 10 Bushels wheat 20 Bushels
of Corn 200 lbs of the 10th Sugar & 10 lbs Coffee and
also find her in Flax Cotton wool sufficient
for her clothing & she to have her privilege
in the house that I now live in & find her in
fire wood & wash for her if she wants it done &
find her in salt sufficient for her use & also
find her cows, during her natural life & at her
death to be equally divided amongst my
children. I Give & bequeath to my beloved

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Catherine Leach. Eliza both Healy. Susan
Cline. Polly Selzer. Phoebe Duglax & John
Wyke. Four hundred dollars each. etc. etc.
Duglax must account for \$2500. her share will
more than the others. I will be bound to
my daughter Catherine 1000 & must give
one negro boy Cannon & a negro girl named
Carline both at \$525. as her share, leaving \$1300
instead of the \$400. share which to her in
the article above. I also will be bound
to Polly wife of James Selzer one negro girl
named Maria at \$375. in place of the above
\$400. & she is to get \$250. I will be bound to
my daughter John Wyke one negro girl
named Michael at \$150. instead of \$400. she
is to get \$250. also I will to my daughter Mary
2 Cows & Calves one cow & pig one Cow & Lamb
2 Buck Steers & furniture one spinning wheel
& pair of Cards & a good furniture one table
& Chest & Kitchen furniture. as to the other
of my black ones I will that it should be
before I sell them that my intention shall be
to whoever may buy them & the remainder which
is not sold shall be sold & equally divided
amongst my children. Because my son John &
Jacob have each received of me \$400. for which
reason they shall be equal in receiving the
balance of my estate except Jacob who has recei-
ved \$450. I do hereby revoke all other will
by me heretofore made & do Ordain constitute
& make this my last Will & Testament in
Witness whereof I appear my beloved
son David Wyke Executor of this my last
Will & Testament. In Witness whereof this

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I and Jacob Wyke have hereunto set my
hand & seal to this my last will & Testament
the day & year above written.
