

66 Will of Deceased 1827

The following will was proved in open Court and
admitted to Record (1827)

In the name of God Amen I Margaret Hoyt of the State
of North Carolina and County of Lenoire being weak
of body but of sound and perfect mind and memory
(Blessed be God) and having into consideration the certainty
of death, do this 13th day of June in the year of Lord
1823 make and publish this my last will and testament,

In manner following (VIZ) first I Recommend
my Soul into the hands of a mighty who give it,
and my Body to be decently Buried, and all my Just
debts to be paid and I give and bequeath unto my
Beloved ^{Grand} Son Michael Whayne, fifty Dollars, and also
to the five Children of my Grandson Jacob Rhyns
which were Born in wedlock with his wife Catharine
fifty dollars, that is ten Dollars each, to be paid to them
by my executor of the first money collected after my Just
debts are paid, and it is then my will that the remain-
der of my estate which I have not otherwise Disposed of Both
Real or personal shall be equally divided between (my
Children) (VIZ) John, Barbara, Mary, Susannah,
Elizabeth, Catharine, John, Margaret, and Anne
to be Either sold by my executor or said office and sold
in which ever way, a majority of my said name Children or
a majority of the surviving ones may choose or direct,
and I do hereby appoint my worthy friend & nephew
Andrew Hoyt executor of this my last will and testament
and hereby Requesting all former bills in which I have been
have signed at my house and read this 13th day of June in the year of our Lord 1823
