

The following will was proved in Open Court & admitted to Record 1823—

In the name of God. I, Simon T. Hatchford of the County of Worcester being now in body but of sound & perfect mind & memory. Being to the thoughtfully & for the purpose of making this my last will & testament in manner & form following 1st I give & bequeath unto my eldest Son William Hatchford thirty dollars or equivalent value & the half of my negro Boy Sep 2^d I give to my ^{second} son Samuel Hatchford thirty dollars the other half of my negro Boy Sep also a bare of banner 3^d I give & bequeath unto my Son Joseph Hatchford my negro Boy named Sticks my Kitchen Cupboard & furniture also one hundred dollars & the balance of the money arising from the Canada notes which are coming to me I will to him forever 4th I will to my Son Henry Hatchford five dollars 5th I will to my Son John Hatchford five dollars 6th I will to my daughter Jane her share of a house which she has now in her possession & her Cupboard also several other articles which she got of me 7th I will to my Grand daughter Mary Jane Hatchford daughter of my Son Joseph Hatchford the Bed & Bedstead which I have only made use of with all the necessary clothing.

8th I will to my Grand daughter Mary Campbell Hatchford daughter of Campbell Hatchford my Bed & Bedstead & the necessary clothing.

9th my will is that my daughter Jane her other should keep the balance of my Bed & clothing after she already is furnished in due station as she thinks proper. I do hereby appoint Andrew Simpson & John Macken my executors of this my last will & testament hereby

 do make & appoint this my last will & testament
 First I give & bequeath unto my son Alexander
 Davis my Walnut Box & the value appraised
 of which I may be possessed -

2^d I give & bequeath unto my daughter Sally
 Davis five dollars in Cash & one bed & one table
 & Bed furniture. 3^d It is my will that my lands
 & all my property be sold by my executor
 & that after the payment of all my Just debts
 & the above bequests the monies & sum arising from
 the said Sale shall be equally divided among my
 four daughters Sally, Elizabeth, Margaret & Mary
 Sally I nominate & appoint my son Alexander Davis my
 friend John Johnston my executor of this my last will
 & testament Revoking & annulling all former wills &
 testaments by me heretofore made bearing date during
 this to be my last will & testament in witness whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand & seal the 6th day of
 Oct in the year of our Lord 1824 Signed Sealed &
