Also I give & bequeath unto my dearly loved wife all
my moveable property, to be at her disposal while
she lives excepting my smith to be my own & after my
death my mother's smith work during her life & after
her death unto my dearly beloved wife all my negroes
if there be any after my death, to be in her during her
life & after my wife's decease, then sold at public sale
the money arising from thence to be equally divided
among my six children viz to my daughter Elizabeth
to my Anna & to my daughter Martha & to my daughter
Coley & to my son James & to my daughter Ruth.
I give & bequeath to my son William viz, Clung, one
pound. I give unto my daughter Elizabeth one
black mare & I give unto my daughter Martha one
called Sally. I give & bequeath to my
two daughters to wit Elizabeth & Martha, all stock
of cattle after my decease. And I give and
bequeath unto my daughter Martha my loom &
all belonging to the same, providing she does
her Mother's weaving during her Mother's life time.

Baird, of the County of Lincoln and State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and memory, do make, ordain & constitute and appoint this instrument of writing to be my last will and testament. I do hereby disavow & revoke all former wills, and do hereby declare, to be my last will & testament as follows:

- 2^d I will allow my just debts to be paid
- 3^d I will allow my watch to Hugh Torrance's daughter Polly
- 4th I will allow my gun to Hugh Torrance's daughter Betty
- 5th I will allow ten dollars to Hugh Torrance's daughter Polly
- 6th I will and allow the balance of my Estate to Hugh Torrance.

niture, beds & chests & all belonging to the house, the
same is to be my two daughters viz Elizabeth &
Martha. I give & bequeath to my son James
the remainder of my land if there is any more
than what is mentioned in the will. I give &
bequeath unto beloved grandson Edward McElung
all I own, my saddle, after my death. I likewise
constitute & make & is done my beloved daughter Elizabeth
my beloved son James McElung, Executors of this my
last will & Testament. In witness whereof I have
