Paul Kistler's will

In the name of God amen, I Paul Kistler of the County of Lincoln State of South Carolina, Being of sound mind memory & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do in the following manner dispose of the worldly estate wherewithal it has pleased God to bless me. In the first place give my soul in to the hands of Almighty God who gave it, my body to the earth to be buried in Christian like manner viz—

First, I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Anne Kistler during her life or widowhood, my house lot in the Town of Lincolnton, together with the upper Wimpy tract of land, also the David Zimmerman tract of land, also the following negroes viz Henry, Jerry, Sam, Charles, Betty, Alice, and her four children viz Caroline Sunday, Annie, Betsy, and also a negro girl named Mary, all my house kitchen furniture, harnessing implements of every description, wagons, carriage, carrying all, also my stock of horses, cattle, shags, also all my money, mostly I have only, also the remainder of the proceeds of the sale of such property as I may direct to be sold, by this will after paying for my debts which legacies and money direct to be paid immediately, with the following executors named, witness that my sons Andrew & Robert are

tide for all men once to die, do in the following man-
ner dispose of the residuary estate wherewithal it has
pleased God to bless me. In the first place I give
my soul in to the hands of Almighty God who gave
it my body to the earth to be buried in Christian
like manner viz -

First, I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Anne Kettle
during her life or widowhood, my house & lot in the
Town of Lincoln, together with the Tower Minnery
tract of land, also the David Zimmerman tract of
land, also the following negroes viz Henry, Jerry, Sam
Moses, Betty, Alice, and her four children viz Caroline
Liddy, Maria, Kety, and also a negro girl named
Ellen, all my house kitchen furniture, & various
implements of every description, wagons, carriages,
Carrig all, also my stocks of horses, cattle, sheep,
also all my money, notes & account, also the
proceeds of the sale of the estate of such prop-
erty as I may direct to be sold, by this will after
paying for my debts which requires us to pay direct
to be paid immediately, with the following execu-
tions, found that my sons David & Robert are
to have decent support out of the above named
property during the life time of my said wife
second, I will bequeath to my son William such

property as I have heretofore given them, also the further sum of two hundred dollars to be paid at my decease by my executors -

Third - I will bequeath to my daughter Nancy Singer, all the property I have heretofore given her.

Fourth - Will they wealth to my daughter Mary Warlick, all the property I have heretofore given her Fifth, I give my wealth to my daughter Elizabeth Royal all the property I have heretofore given her.

Sixth, I give my wealth to my son Nathan his negroes Harry & Harry at the death of my wife, also the one half of house lot on which I live & the one half of the lot of land containing the same freed and also the one third of the above described tract of land.

Seventh - I give my wealth to my son Franklin a negro boy named Abram, and at the death of my wife, I will that my executors pay him the sum of six hundred dollars in order to make his portion of my estate as near equal with the remainder of my children as possible.

Eighth - I will bequeath to my son Peter a negro boy named Adam & the one third part of the John Aboussie tract of land.

Ninth - I will bequeath to my daughter

Sugar, all the property I have in my possession
here.

Fourth, I will bequeath to my daughter Mary
Wardick, all the property that she has before given her.
Fifth, I give bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth
Kozell all the property that she has before given
her.

Sixth, I give bequeath to my son Jackson two negroes
slaves & money at the death of my wife, also the
one half of house lot on which I live & the one
half of the lot of land containing the same yard
and also the one third of the John Stouffer
tract of land.

Seventh, I give bequeath to my son Franklin
a negro boy named Abram, and at the death
of my wife, I will that my executors pay him
the sum of six hundred dollars in order to
make his portion of my estate as near equal
with the remainder of my children as possible.

Eighth, I will bequeath to my son Peter a
negro boy named Adam & the other third part
of the John Stouffer tract of land.

Ninth, I will bequeath to my daughter
Margaret Hill, a negro boy named Wilson and
all the other property that she has in her possession
and at my death I will direct that my
executors pay her the sum of twenty five

dollars, for the purchase of a horse bridle, and
at the death of my wife, I will bequeath to Margaret
and still the tract of land I purchased from
R. Duncum, the accounting to my estate for the
sum of three hundred fifty dollars, which my
executors retain out of my estate previous to her
receiving any sum of my estate.

Ninth. I will bequeath to my son Robert at
the death of my wife a negro boy named Jerry
and a negro girl named Sunday, also the one
half of the house I lot I live in and the one
half of the lot of land including the garden
and also the one third of the bottom strupper tract
of land.

Tenth. The balance of my estate of every
kind I direct that my executors put to sale &
after paying my debt & the legacies directed
to be paid at my death, the balance of the
proceeds of sale to be paid over to my wife as
before directed.

Eleventh. And at the death of my wife I will
direct the remainder of my estate of every kind
not disposed of by this will, to be put to sale
by my executors, the proceeds of the sale together
with all money, notes & account, to be collected
& divided amongst my children in the follow-
ing manner viz. William, Fancy, Hinger

Sum of three hundred fifty dollars, which my
executors retain out of my estate previous to their
receiving any sum of my estate.

Ninthly. I will bequeath to my son Robert at
the death of my wife a negro boy named Jerry
and a negro girl named Tuesday, also the one
half of the house lot I live in and the one
half of the lot of land including the garden
and also the one third of the John Sturper tract
of land -

Tenthly. The balance of my estate of every
kind I direct that my executors put to sale &
after paying my debts the legacies directed
to be paid at my death. The balance of the
proceeds of sale to be paid over to my wife as
before directed -

Eleventhly. And at the death of my wife I will
& direct the remainder of my estate of every kind
not disposed of by this will. To be put to sale
by my executors. The proceeds of the sale together
with all monies, notes & accounts, to be collected
& divided amongst my children in the follow-
ing manner viz. William, Nancy Hinger
Eliza Madick, Elizabeth Rozelle, & a son
Franklin, Peter, Robert & Margaret Hill
Grace and those alike -

I hereby appoint my son Gardner Webster

and Henry Braxton Executors of this my last
will & Testament, signed sealedacknowledged
by the said Paul Weller as his last will &
testament, April 17th 1847.
