I Peter Hoyt of Lincoln County in the state of  
North Carolina, being advanced in Years and in a low  
state of health, but of sound Mind & Memory,  
Calling to mind the uncertainty of life & the certainty  
of death do make and publish this to be my last  
Will & Testament in the manner & form following

First My will is that all My just debts & personal  
Expences be paid out of My estate

And I Will and bequeath to my beloved wife Catherine  
one third part of the cleared Land on which I now live  
with the privilege of fire wood & lumber of every description  
to keep up the same, together with the Mansion  
house & such other out buildings as will be necessary  
for her ~~use~~ this to be in that part of the Land that

I shall will to my son David, and to be entirely his  
at the death of his Mother, likewise I will to My said  
wife Catherine, during her life or widowhood, a negro  
boy named Ned and a Girl named Nancy  
both about fifteen years of age, which said negroes  
& their increase at the death of My said wife if any  
increase are to be sold at the discretion as to the credit of  
My Executors and the Money or monies arising therefrom  
to be equally divided amongst all My Children or the  
Survivor or survivors of them share & share alike.

Whereas My said wife for her first Years support  
after My death is to have two hundred bushels of Corn  
thirty bushels of rye at & a Sufficiency of p. etc. & also  
also two bushels of salt 30 lb of coffee & sixty weight  
of sugar, also I give & bequeath unto her My said wife  
one table six chairs, the kitchen cupboard & the  
furniture, one wash bottle and the broom or brooms  
furniture, her chest two beds & furniture.

the riding Chain & harness, one plough, 1 set of Gears  
two Cows & Calves, four head of sheep, one bee hive  
her choice, one Loom & its necessary apparatus, a wheel  
Cards, 40 weight of picked or machine cotton,  
a flour chest, a Bible & hymn book, all the above  
property bequeathed to My said wife to be at her  
own disposal except the Lard & the two negroes  
3<sup>rd</sup> I will and bequeath to My son John the  
Land and plantation herein after described including  
his present residence, Beginning on the dividing line  
between My Land & David Hunkles, at the mouth  
of the two Lanes the one leading from My house  
to said Hunkles & the Lane from Hunkles or rather  
where the two Lanes meet & Likewise the Lane that leads  
towards the Meeting house or where the three Lanes come  
together and running thence with said David Hunkles  
Lane south 42 West, to a stake on John Metz's Lane  
thence south 49 East 76 poles to a hickory said Metz's  
Corner, thence on the same Course to a stake on County  
Line thence N<sup>o</sup> 26 East with County Line to a hickory  
My own Corner. thence N<sup>o</sup> 5 West 44 poles to a post oak  
lying inside of My field, thence through the field to  
the Beginning together with the use of the Land  
on which his tan Yard is on, during his residence  
on the Land as the above described bounds does not  
include the tan Yard, as it is My will & intention  
if John should relinquish the Farming business or  
make sale of the Land, that then the Land on which  
the tan Yard stands is to belong to My son David,  
this Land which I have bequeathed to John I  
consider equal in Value to what I heretofore gave to  
My sons Jacob & Michael

4<sup>th</sup> The balance of the Land on which I now live I will and bequeath to my son David, with the exception as here before of my wife living a week in said Land, Likewise, I will bequeath to him the said David forty three acres of Land more or less, forming the Land I have willed to my son John & Abner Smith, and about fourteen or fifteen acres of new entries, joining my own and the Meeting House Land, together with a negroe Boy named Bill about eight Years old and a horse called Charley, my Saddle & Bridle, One bar share & one shovel plough, & Gear for one horse, his choice of the ploughs & Gear, the old or little waggon & one bee hive,

5<sup>th</sup> I will & bequeath to my daughter Fanny two beds <sup>steads</sup> & furniture one bureau, the Candle stand her wheel, a negoe boy named Andy about seven Years old, one vessel man called Peter, her Saddle & Bridle, one table together with some Kitchen and dressing furniture to be equal to what my married Daughters received, this portion I conceive to be something more than my four married Daughters received, but my reason for doing so is that she has remained longer with me & therefore is intitled to more

6<sup>th</sup> I will & bequeath to my last daughter Mary & Elizabeth two hundred dollars each to be paid out of my Estate, which sum or sums of money is to be left in with my said wife Catherine to be kept by her & applied to their support or use at her discretion

The balance of lands viz one tract lying on Little  
Creek of buffalo the quantity unknown, one tract  
known by the stricker tract & a small entry or tract  
joining the same, likewise the balance of my negroes  
that are not disposed of in this my last Will viz  
So. Phely King, Ocas, Alfred, Leah, Lyness,  
Hobby, & Manuel, together with my other property  
of every description not bequeathed I will & direct  
to be sold at publick sale by my Executors on a credit  
of not less than twelve Months, and after paying  
the debts, funeral expences & Legacies herein bequeathed  
together with all other proceeds by debts owing to me or  
any manner whatsoever, I allow & direct to be equally  
divided between My said wife Catherine and all my  
Children their survivor or survivors share & share alike  
In testimony & Confirmation of the foregoing will I the  
said Peter Hath hereunto set my hand & seal this  
20<sup>th</sup> day of December 1826 & in the 37<sup>th</sup> year of our  
independence, signed sealed published & declared in  
the presence of \_\_\_\_\_

Lastly I nominate & appoint  
Daniel Hoke Esqr & John  
Ransom Esqr whole & sole  
executors of this my last Will  
& testament

Codicil to the foregoing Will

I Will and bequeath to My son David a bed  
bedstead & furniture, the Iron Mill called the  
Cobb Mill, & the new grind stone, which last  
articles are to remain on the plantation & that My  
son John & his mother have the privilege &  
use of the mill & Grind stone, Likewise I give to  
David the little Rifle gun & steel pouch.

Further I will & bequeath to my daughters Mary  
& Elizabeth each a bed bedstead & furniture
