April Sessions 1854 Philip Canaler will

In the name of God Amen.

I Philip Canaler ~~sen~~ of the County of Lincoln
in the State of North Carolina. being advanced in age,
but of sound and disposing mind and memory; Do
hereby make and ordain, the following to be my last
Will and Testament; My body I give to its mother
earth to be interred in a Christian like manner and
my Soul I resign to God who gave it.

And as regards my worldly Estate wherewith
heaven has blessed me I dispose of it in the
following manner

Item ~~1st~~ I give to my grand-son Adolphus Canaler
one Down lot in the Town of Lincolnton in the South
West square of said Town adjoining the lot on
which the Methodist Church is situate. I also
give to him five hundred acres of my Reinhardt
Tract of Land to be taken from the lower part

of said tract and to include the house in which Adolphus lives and the improvements he has put thereon. Also my negro Joe which he has in possession

Item 2nd I give to my grand-son William Candler four hundred dollars.

Item 3rd I give to my grand-daughter Adalade Candler one Town lot in the Town of Lincoln in the South East Square of said Town opposite the Methodist Church and East of the main Cross Street in said Town.

Item 4th I give to my grand-son Philip Rudisell Jr. negro woman named Charlotte & her children and her increase said negro woman is the same which I heretofore put in the possession of my daughter Elizabeth Rudisell and which is now in the possession of my son-in-law Philip Rudisell Sr. and I not will him any land.

Item 5th I give to my grand daughter Polly ~~wife of~~ Joseph Barringer five hundred dollars.

Item 6th I give to my grand daughter Eliza wife of Eli Deal five hundred dollars.

Item 7th I give to my grand daughter Fanny wife of Jacob Deal five hundred dollars.

Item 8th I give to my five great grand children being the children of my grand-son Marcus Rudisell dead each one hundred dollars that is five hundred dollars.

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Item 5th I give to my grand daughter Polly ~~wife of~~ Joseph Barringer five hundred dollars.

Item 6th I give to my grand daughter Elizabeth wife of Eli Deal five hundred dollars.

Item 7th I give to my grand daughter Fanny wife of Jacob Deal five hundred dollars.

Item 8th I give to my five great grand children being the children of my grand-son Marcus Rudisell ~~decd~~ each one hundred dollars that is five hundred dollars between all of the children of Marcus Rudisell ~~decd~~.

Item 9th I give to the child of my grand daughter Anna Powell (now dead) and who was the wife of Robt Powell to her child I give one hundred dollars.

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Item 10th I give, Will and bequeath unto my son Henry Canaler all the ballance of my property and Estate Real, Personal and mixed to him his heirs forever.

And lastly I hereby nominate and appoint my son Henry Canaler the Executor of this my last Will and Testament and do hereby ~~make~~ make and declare nul & void all other and former Wills by me heretofore executed or signed and published and declare this only to be my last Will & Testament
