

In the name of God. I, John Scott, of Lucy  
of the County of Pinckney, State of South Carolina being  
of sound & perfect mind & unimpeachable to God, do this  
thirteenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand  
eight hundred & thirteen, make & publish this my last will &  
testament in manner following, that is to say

First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary, one half  
her choice, saddle & bedding all my bedings, house hold & kitchen  
furniture, to dispose of as she may think proper -  
I also allow her my negro man Sharper & his choice of  
one negro woman Gaderon Sally, during & her natural life, or  
if she thinke proper with my executors to sell said negroe  
either publickly or privately, as they may think proper,  
& her to have the interest of said money & the principal  
to be kept in the hands of my executors, & at her death to  
be equally divided among my children, here named  
Margaret, Elizabeth, William, Michael, Mary, James  
and Nancy.

I will & bequeath to my son John that part of my plantation  
that I now live on known by the name of the McRitch  
plantation, and I allow my son John to pay into the hands of  
my executors two hundred dollars, after my death to be  
divided as hereafter named.

The other part of my plantation which I purchased from  
Henry Thompson, I allow to be sold by my executors  
either at publick or private sale as they may think  
proper & to be divided as hereafter named. I bequeath  
to my beloved wife Mary all my clothes & all my  
books to dispose of as she may think proper among my  
children. The residue of my property not here named  
allowable to be sold by my executors at publick sales &  
after paying my just debts to pay over to my daughter

Jane & Anna, five dollars. The balance of the estate with all the money due for the land, I allow to be equally divided among my children here named my beloved wife, their share shall be Margaret, Elizabeth, William, Michael, Mary, James and Nancy, & me. I hereby make & ordain my son, William & Robert C. Little, Executors of this my last will & Testament. In witness whereof, I the said Robert Tracy do sign to this my last will & Testament set my hand & seal the day & year above written.

### State of South Carolina Vincennes County

That it remembred that I William Little, the testator and County, also said, decenditute, make & ordain this my last will and Testament, first I do give unto my known neare  
Gittler, John F. Little, & Sam'l Little sons of George Little,  
the sum of fifty nine dollars cash, to be paid to them  
on their Guardianship of several notes which I have no  
different people. I do further give to the above named  
William Little son of George, my wife Oceanus Little  
I do also give to William Little son of my brother, his  
fifty nine dollars, to be paid, as above mentioned. Also  
give to George Nixon, son of Isaac Nixon, twenty dollars to be  
applied to the use of schooling said George Nixon  
I do also give a certain bottle, called the Queen of Blad  
to my brother John Little, which was a request of his
