of the County of Lincoln & State of North Carolina being
of sound & perfect mind & memory, bless'd be God, do this
thirteenth day of March in the year one thousand
eight hundred & thirty, make & publish this my last will &
testament in manner following, that is to say

First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary one hundred
her choice & a debt & bidle & all my bedding house hold & kitchen
furniture to dispose of as she may think proper -
I also allow her my negro man & Harpers & her choice of
my negro woman Gudey & Sally, during her natural life, or
if she thinks proper with my executors to sell said negro
either publicly or privately, as they may think proper,
& her to have the interest of said money & the principal
to be kept in the hands of my executors, & at her death to
be equally divided among my children, here named
Margaret, Elizabeth, William, Michael, Mary, James
and Nancy

I will & bequeath to my son John that part of my plantation
that I now live on known by the name of the McIsick
plantation, and I allow my son John to pay into the hands of
my Executors two hundred dollars, after my death to be
divided as here after named,

The other part of my plantation which I purchased from
Henry Thompson, I allow to be sold by my Executors
either at publick or private sale as they may think
proper & to be divided as here after named. I bequeath
to my beloved wife Mary all my cloths and all my
books to dispose of as she may think proper among my
children. The residue of my property not here named
I allow to be sold by my Executors at publick sale &
after paying my just debts to pay over to my daughter

James & Latta, five dollars. The balance of the estate, with all the money due for the land, I allow to be equally divided among my children here named my beloved wife, then share & share Margaret, Elizabeth, William, Michael, Mary, James and Nancy, &c. I hereby make & ordain my son, William & Robert, E. Bell, Executors of this my last will & Testament. In witness whereof, I the said Robert Mox have to this my last will & Testament set my hand & seal the day & year above written.
