In the Name of God Amen I Robert Nixon
of the County & State aforesaid (St. Lawrence Lincoln County)
being of a sound & perfect Mind & Memory blessed
be God. At this 24th day of March in the year of
Our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred & thirty five
make & publish this my last will & Testament
in the manner following Viz

1st It is my Will & desire that all my just debts
& funeral expenses be paid out of my estate
2nd I give & bequeath to my beloved wife
Catharine Nixon my plantation my Negro girl
Gul Lot & all my stock of horses Cows & hogs & all
my Waggons & all the rest of my property that
is not mentioned in the following items. During
her life time

3rd I bequeath & give unto my three sons John
Nixon Robert Nixon & Henry Nixon my plantation
after my beloved Catharine's decease & for my home
to remain a home for any one of my family
while they see proper to stay

4th I give & bequeath to all my beloved sons &
daughters all the rest of my estate to be equally
divided between them all that is after Catharine's
decease.

5th I give & bequeath to my son in
law John M Rankin the use of one third part
of my M^o seat for ten years.

6th It is
my Will & desire that my Negro girl Lots and
shall be for the use of my three children
while they live.

And do hereby make & order
my beloved son John Nixon & my worthy
friend William Nixon Executors of this my
