

10 July Sessions 1827

In the name of God Amen I Samuel Brimmer Sen^r
of the State of North Carolina & County of Lincoln
being weak in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory
do make and publish this my last will and testament in
manner & form following; that is to say, First I give
& bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Brimmer.
One bed steady bed and furniture, the best that I have, My
Negro woman Fanny, One Cupboard, & Cupboard furniture,
My Kitchen furniture, My large Chest, & by hundred dollars
in Cash, I also give & devise to my Daughter Anna Youngblood,
her heirs & assigns the tract of land that I now
live on, My Daughter in Law Abby Brimmer, is to have
her lifetime use the part that she now lives on,
that is to say, beginning on Colonel Blackburns line
below her house on the Spring Branch, thence with
with the Spring to the head, & thence to a thick oak corner
on the widow Elizabeth Hammers line, and at her death
it is to Return to Anna Youngblood her heirs & assigns,
The balance of my property both Real and personal I wish
to be sold, and the one half to be divided between the
heirs of my son Isaac Brimmer, and the balance to be divided
between the Children of my Daughter Anna Youngblood,
I also give and bequeath unto the heirs of my daughter
Mary Armstrong, her boarding from the time she
Came to my house to this time, I hereby appoint
William Youngblood, and Joseph Hart, sole executors
of this my last will and testament, hereby Revoking all
former wills by me made.
Further whereof I have hereunto set my hand

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and seal the 2nd day of June in the Year of Our
Lord One thousand eight hundred & twenty six
