I, Sarah E. Hoke of The  
County and state aforesaid do ~~make~~ and declare this  
to be my last will and Testament  
First. After the payment of my just debts, I will and  
bequeath to my brother Robert H. Hoke all my real and  
personal estate (Except such small articles as are hereinafter  
disposed of) in trust nevertheless, to hold for the use and benefit  
of my mother Frances Hoke during her life, and at her death  
to be equally divided between my brothers Robert, Marcus and  
George.

Second. I will and bequeath to my niece Lizzy Smith Two  
hundred dollars in money to be kept at interest for her until  
she arrives at the age of sixteen years. I also will to my niece  
Lizzy Smith my blue ring.

To my brother Robert I will my gold sleeve buttons.

To my brother Marcus I will my hair cross

To my brother George I will my Gold brooch

To my sister Mary I will my pearl ring and my Vermilion  
beads. To my mother I will my Cameo pin. To my aunt

Sarah Barton I will my hair necklace. To my aunt Julia

Barton I will my Gold Thimble. To my niece Fanny Smith

I will my Pearl ring. To my cousin Mary Adams I will my

My blue ring.

To my brother Robert I will my gold sleeve buttons.

To my brother Moses I will my hair cross

To my brother George I will my Gold Leaf

To my sister Mary I will my scarf ring and my Vermilion  
beads. To my mother I will my Cameo pin. To my aunt  
Sarah Burton I will my hair necklace. To my aunt Julia  
Burton I will my Gold Thimble. To my niece Fanny Smith  
I will my Pearl ring. To my cousin Mary Adams I will my  
Coral pin. To my cousin Frances Adams I will my books  
and sheets of music.

I do hereby appoint my brother Robert F. Hoke and my  
uncle A. M. Burton Executors of this my last will and  
Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
