Susanna Reep's Will

Lincoln County

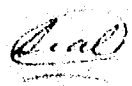
I Susanna Reep of said County of Lincoln and State aforesaid, having been supported by my daughter Barbara Clay who has had a large family of Children to support, and who has been partly able to support her family, and since I have lived with ~~her~~ my daughter Barbara Clay, I have frequently been sick and unable to do any thing for myself during all of said time my said daughter has ministered my wants in sickness and health, and so far as her limited means would permitted has discharged the duties of an affectionately and dutiful Child, in consideration of said services and my natural affection for my daughter Barbara, my eye which has been in the possession of my son Philip Reep, and after my death all my clothes, bed and bedding, and any money I may ^{then} have, and as a pension has been granted to me, for the Revolutionary services of my husband Adam Reep, I by these presents give and bequeath any amount of pension that may be due me at the time of my death to my said daughter Barbara Clay, as all the compensation I can make to her for sustaining me in my afflictions, in testimony whereof I have hereunto affixed my seal and subscribed my name, this 3^d day of May 1841

Barbara Clay, as all the compensation I can make to
her for sustaining me in my afflictions, in testimony
whereof I have hereunto affixed my seal and subscribed
my name, this 3 day of May 1841
