I Thomas Beanes Sr. of the County of Lincoln
State of North Carolina being of sound & perfect
mind & memory. Blessed be God to this 28th
day of May in the Year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred & thirty one Make & Publish this
my last will & Testament in manner following
That is to say That I give & bequeath unto my
son Jacob after my death the plantation
whereon I now live & also the one half of the
pine land on Shuck's branch including the
improvements & also the pastures which he has
received already my desire is that my son
Jacob continue to live on the plantation during
my life & manage the same & that he have
the profits of the same & of everything which I shall
want of said plantation necessary for my
support which I intend to manage myself
the said well & properly my son Jacob his
heirs & assigns shall have it for ever excepting
that my son Jacob shall let my daughter
Elizabeth have the privilege of living & selling
wheat during her life or at least as long
as she shall live in some of the houses &
part of garden & other truck patches & some
land for cultivation & part of the meadow
sufficient to support two cows & calves but
if she should sell the plantation to that
Elizabeth loses her privilege on the land
if turned off then the said Jacob shall pay
one hundred dollars to the said Elizabeth
or by disavowing he shall pay the sum
so that she can go there & purchase
also but if the said Elizabeth should make it her

choice to give up her privilege of the plantation
to the said Jacob. then he the said Jacob shall
pay to her the one hundred dollar but in case
the said Elizabeth should marry she loses her
right & privilege on the plantation but Jacob
is to pay her the hundred dollar —

And I give Blequealls unto my daughter Elizabeth
the one half of the pine land in Shuck's branch
to the wood land including Shuck's branch & a
negro girl named Marriot. One Bear, three
deer & a stand with the house furniture belonging to
said boy & also a horse & cart of her own choice
Out of the horses that will be left at my death
three cows one table one saddle & bridle one
dough trough with a table put in it & also a
sufficiency of kitchen furniture & Cassin's
table furniture for her to keep house. I allow
her to make choice of the kind & quantity
that may suit & satisfy her one spinning
wheel, one big wheel of her choice three sheep
three hog of her choice also cotton & flax for one
year clotting & all the grain either in the
Barren or fields or crib — the said Elizabeth
is to have said & will be property her heirs &
assigns forever — Third I give Elizabeth
unto my son Daniel the sum of five dollars him
that he his forever — 4th after my death I direct
all my personal property that is not herein
particularly directed to be sold & equally
divided between my children that shall be survivors
as follows Solomon, Henry, Philip, Thomas, Jacob
Bartholomew, Elizabeth, Polly, Mary, & I hereby direct
that the will & part of my daughters shall be paid into
their hands & kept in the hands for their support but they
may do with it as they please

And I hereby make Jordan my worthy
Lewis Marlock & David Ramsbottom Executors
of my last will & Testament In witness whereof
I the said Thomas Horner have to my last will
& Testament set my hand & Seal this day & date
also written signed sealed & published & declared
by the said Thomas Horner the testator
his last will & Testament in the presence
of us who were present at the time of signing
the same

John Stagle one of the Justices of the Peace in & for
said County Henry Miller, James Lambey &
Paul Anthony & after being duly sworn upon the
Holy Evangelists of Almighty God & sworn to testify
that they were called upon by Thomas Horner
concerning his last will & Testament & that he
requested to attach this as a codicil to his
last will that it was on the 24th day of June
1833 & that they believe him to be of perfect
sound mind at the time for devising the same
which they relate to me

Mr Horner further testified that his daughter
Elizabeth should have been seen & signed of his
stock of her own choice, & five two years
Barrow of his stock & that yearling steers of his
stock & five sheep of his stock of her choice
that the said Elizabeth in stock Barrow &
went before me this day of April 1833
