

November 29th 1833

In the name of god Amen. I William B. Brady of the County of Lincoln & State of North Carolina, being Weak in body but of sound Mind & Memory & Calling to mind that it is the lot of all man kind to die Therefore that I may settle my worldly concerns do make this my last will & Testament as follows, First I Will & bequeath to my beloved Wife Elizabeth Brady all the tract of land whereon I now live, during her natural life & then it is my Will that my son Eliza Hoyle Brady have said tract to have & to hold. 2nd I Will to my said wife Elizabeth my four mare also my red cow & bull & the black heifer & the two bulls. also all the hogs except the white & black hams. also one head of sheep her choiced also one plow & the necessary gearing for one horse. with single tree & clevis. also my new shoes & two small ones also all the household & kitchen furniture. except such as she will not need including meat barrels & two meal barrels I also Will to her all my present crop including the wheat, rye, & corn & potatoes & garden & provender. also one tub & churn also one side of sole leather & upper. also her saddle & bridle & blanket also all the bacon in my smoke house & four bushels of salt also my wearing apparel & my best ax & meat ax also thirty weight of sugar & fifteen of coffee

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The balance of my property is to be
sold & all my just debts & funeral expenses
~~paid~~ & the balance to go to my said
Wife Elizabeth. I do hereby Consti-
tute & appoint my friend John Wilson
Jr. my sole Executor & I do hereby re-
voke all other wills & make this my last
will & Testament. Given under my hand
& seal this 1st day of Sept. 1835
in presence of
Oliver W. Hollans Jr. &
