In the name of God Amen I Mary Simpson being in sound mind and memory thanks be to God for the same calling to mind the Mortality of the body do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament to wit
Item I give and bequeath unto the Heirs of my beloved Son Benjamin Simpson two Hundred Acres of Land whereon he now lives, it being one half of the tract whereon I now live to them and their Heirs forever

Item 2 I give and bequeath to my beloved Daughter Deborah Simpson two Hundred Acres of Land whereon she now lives it being one half of the tract of Land whereon I now live to her and her Heirs forever

Item 3 My further desire is that the fifty two Dollars and fifty Cents which Samuel Hollis owes me to be equally divided

between the Heirs of Benjamin Simpson and my Daughter Deborah Simpson

Item 4 Should Samuel fail to pay for the Land then in that case if my desire is that the Land be equally divided between the Heirs of Benjamin Simpson and Deborah Simpson

Item 5 I also give six head of Cattle to be equally divided between the Heirs of Benjamin Simpson and my Daughter Deborah Simpson to them and their Heirs forever - also all the residue of my property I wish to be divided as above -

I constitute and appoint my beloved Son Benjamin Simpson an Executor to this my last Will and Testament



In the name of God Amen. I Agathy Baker of Martin County being of sound and disposing mind and memory (thanks be to God) do this 30th day of June in the year of our Lord 1830 make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form as follows, that is to say
Item 1 I give to my niece Eliza & Polly Harvey two Hundred Dollars each and Negro Woman Nancy
Item 2 I give to my niece Martha Emily and Mariah Harvey each two Hundred and fifty Dollars -
Item 3 I give to my nephew John Harvey Negro girl Artemisia and one bed and furniture to include a stained Bedstead new in my House

- 4th I give unto my niece Elizabeth Harvey the tract of Land I now live on all my Household and Kitchen furniture not before and hereafter named 12 Silver Tea spoons Negro man Lempsay Negro girl Catharine and all my Bank stock
- 5th I give to my brother Simmons & Baker sen^r the tract of Land on the west side of deep Creek near Dickens old store in trust for him to sell if he may think best and to purchase other Lands with the money for the benefit and use of my niece Nancy Beverland during her life at her death to be equally divided between her surviving children and in addition to the above named Land I give to said Simmons & Baker in trust one Hundred Dollars and if he should sell the above named Land this sum to be laid out with the proceeds of the Land in purchasing other Lands as above named should he not sell the above named Land and purchase other Lands then I wish him to pay to said Nancy the interest yearly and at her death the money to be equally divided between her surviving children
- 6th I give to my brother Simmons & Baker one Negro man named Guy
- 7th I give to my brother John B Baker his two notes of Land one and now in my possession
- 8th I give to my Nephew Simmons & Baker Land one Horse called Morgan
- 9th I give unto my Nephew James L & Baker one Hundred Dollars in Money
- 10th I give to William R Smith sen^r in trust one Horse called Charles and my carriage and Harness for the benefit and use of Maria's Smith
- 11th I give to my niece Laura Baker my Gold Watch
- 12th I wish the Horse and Carriage given in trust to William R Smith sen^r to be valued at their value I give in money to my Sister Martha
- 13th I give to my Niece Ann M M Hunter one Hundred Dollars in Money
- 14th I wish all my Negroes to be hired out for the year 1831 and 1832 the amount of hire and what money may be due me after

- paying the above legacy and paying my debts I give to my Brother Simmons & Baker sen^r I also give my said brother J & Baker sen^r one third of my Negroes that may remain after the Legacy are paid
- 15th I give to my sister Martha Whitaker one third part of my Negroes that may remain after the Legacy are paid
- 16th I give to my Nephew James L & Baker in trust one third part of my Negroes that may remain after the Legacy are paid for the benefit and use of my Sister Maria's Smith during her life at her death to be equally divided between her surviving children - These Negroes the said James may hire out and pay the proceeds to my said sister Maria or let them be worked on the farm for the support and benefit of Richard Smith and said Maria and family as he may think best
- 17th I give to Marceana Smith my leather travelling Trunk Lastly I hereby make and ordain my brother Simmons & Baker Executor to this my last Will and testament in Witness whereof I the said Agathy Baker have to this my last Will and testament set my hand and seal the day and year above written
