I give and bequeath to my wife Lucilla one negro man named Moses and also one
Negro woman named Fanny the said negro man's wife and also one Negro girl named
Lemah it is also my wish that my wife Lucilla should have my house & plantation
during her life it is also my wish that my son Stephen outthridge should own all
the Land that the said Dan outthridge owns between the Turnpike road and
the great branch and also all the Land over the other side of the Savannah that
I own for him to have and to hold forever and also one Negro man named Lary all the
rest of my Land to my son Joseph at his mother's death and also one negro man named
Stephen all the rest of my negroes to be divided equally among my Daughters it
is my will and desire that my wife Lucilla should have the use of my Bed Room
Held & Kitchen furniture & plantation utensils also give to my wife one Mare and one
young bay horse also to send to my beloved wife my stock of hogs & cattle & sheep
at her death all the said property to be sold and equally divided among my
children - this is my Last will and testament signed and acknowledged in the
presence of us

I Allen Askew of the state of North Carolina and county of Johnston being
in a low state of health but of perfect mind and memory do make
and ordain this instrument of writing to be my last will and testament
(viz) first of all I recommend my soul to god who gave it me and my
body to the earth to be buried in a christian like manner and as touching my
worldly goods it hath pleased god to bless me with in this life I give and
dispose of in the manner and form following (viz)

First my desire is that all my last debts be paid
then I send to my wife Nancy Askew during her life or widowhood all my estate
both real and personal both within and without except so much thereof as
will pay my debts and one hundred

then I give to my son Joseph Askew one hundred to him and his heirs forever

then All the estate or marriage of my wife my will and desire is that all my
estate both real and personal be equally divided between ~~my~~ my children
Joseph, John, Isaac, Benjamin, & Anne, to them and their heirs forever

And chose my worthy friend W. Briggs to this my last will and testament and I do
disannul and revoke all other wills by me made and confirming this and no other
to be my last will and testament in confirmation of which I Allen Askew
have hereunto set my hand and seal this the 23rd May 1820

I Thomas Dine of the state of North Carolina in the county of Johnston being of sound and perfect
mind and memory blessed be god do this the 9th day of September in the year of our Lord 1820
make and publish this my last will and testament in manner following that is to say
I give my well beloved son Thomas Dine one hundred acres of land lying on Littlewood
stream Person it is my will and desire that my son Thomas Dine should have one bed and
furniture and one main and one bow and quelling and their increase and two Bees and
lands and their increase and one Strutt mule and two stocks of bee and their increase
It is my will and desire that my land lying on head water except some domain's line should be sold
at Publick Auction at his month's notice and the money arising to pay my last debt and all that
shall be mine to be equally divided between my children I live unto Thomas Dine and his wife a
certain tract of land bounded as follows beginning in Secoin's Branch at Perry's line down Secoin's
Branch to the fence then a crop the Ridge to a small branch of the Branch to the big path
thence along the path to a small branch then by a line of marked trees to the swamp of the stream
to the corner thence along Henry's line to Perry's line along Perry's line to the first station
also fifty acres of land lying on Secoin's Branch I give this land to Thomas Dine and his wife to convert to the
old plantation whereunto and his and to work well of me for my wife and my son Thomas Dine is married
