which I sold her my land of were appropriating them I give my wife beloved daughter are
beloved son to back all he before of my estate after paying my debts I leave to be
settled among me sons and others made and certain my worthy friends Abram and
John Davis by reason of this my last will and testament I leave of the lands being
left to my son as well and testimony set my hand and seal to day and year above written

one cent for the death of his son and wife to her and his wife to one. Then I bind to my wife beloved
wife Randolph Davis Davis her wherein had my widow plantation and all the land thereunto belonging
and all the rest of my property bedding my own plantation for her to school and raise my children on
and for her to let her children have of her half marry age to their three he has in debt
then I give to my wife beloved wife Randolph Davis my house plantation when he comes to the age of
one hundred and eight his mother will sell the land to his wife as well appear by mutual desire to him
and as soon as can be done. Then I bind my wife beloved wife to my daughter to wit Nancy Davis
Nancy Davis also Davis and Elizabeth to have any property I have valid after their mother death
and to have no more as well a sum to his hundred dollars a piece on the sum the two
hundred ten dollars my wife and Davis to my wife Randolph Davis have my wages money to be paid to
settlement & then it is settled and done. The rest of my history of any his wife Davis a widow all
my four children of his mother both first born a woman and apparent my son Randolph Davis
my wife beloved wife Randolph Davis Bedfathers to this my last will and Testament in witness

in the name of John & Dick Lomax all my horses, muck and 800 bushels of corn
cotton on each year to my son Charles Lomax & on black walnut table to my son
John & Henry. Then I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Biggs and her heirs one
acre by name Sampson after the death of her mother. Then I bind to my son David
one acre by name Lomax after the death of his mother & if David should have
no less than half of his body then to went to my son Charles Lomax Lomax & Martin
Lomax of them. He also I bind unto my son David being owing his natural like two negroes
one dark and one light and of David being should die leaving us his lawfully begotten of
his body then the negroes to revert to my son Charles Lomax Lomax &

whom he next lives and all the land thereunto belonging at this time and appurtenant to my
son Michael King, one negro man named Green to him & his heirs. He also one negro man
named Green after the death of his said mother & my daughter of Lomax & Biggs tools
Then I give & bequeath to my son Charles King & his heirs & to one negro man named
King & my negro tools. Then I give to my son Michael King his heirs &c
one negro man named Peter. Then I give & bequeath to my grand son Michael King
Tools & clothing Starting money. Then I give to my daughter Mary Williams
five dollars Starting money. Then I give to my daughter Elizabeth Parker five
dollars Starting money. Then this my wife & son Michael King & my plantation wherein
I know him after the death of my said wife to sold and the money equally among
between my three sons & their heirs & relatives to say Michael King John & King
& William King after taking out of the said money arising from the sale of the
land so hundred dollars for my son John & King & his heirs & also it is my
will my negro man Green & his two children Matthew & David and all their
heirs increase to sold and the money arising from the sale of said Negroes be
equally divided between my four children of their heirs & Michael King John & King
& William C. King and Nancy Biggs after the death of these I & my mother
Mary King And I hereby make and ordain my two son John & King William
King executor of this my last will & testament in witness whereof I the said
Michael King have to this my last will & testament set my hand & seal the
10th year above written.
